SB 0002 **Relating to Class Size Requirements for Public Schools** Gaetz

Class Size Requirements for Public Schools [WPSC]; Proposes amendments to the State Constitution to revise class size requirements for public schools and to provide an effective date.

SB 0004 **Relating to Education Accountability** Detert

Education Accountability [SPSC]; Amends a provision relating to secondary school redesign, to delete obsolete provisions and to conform to changes made by the act. Revises requirements for middle grades promotion. Provides that successful completion of a high school level Algebra I, Geometry, or Biology I course is not contingent upon a student's performance on the end-of-course assessment. Revises requirements for high school graduation. Creates the Credit Acceleration Program, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2010.

SB 0006 **Relating to Education Personnel** Thrasher

Education Personnel [SPSC]; Authorizes the release of child abuse records to certain employees and agents of the Department of Education. Requires school districts to develop and implement end-of-course assessments. Creates the Performance Fund for Instructional Personnel and School-Based Administrators. Limits bonuses under the Dale Hickam Excellent Teaching Program to individuals who remain continuously employed in a public school in this state, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2010 except as otherwise provided.

Balanced Federal Budget [SPSC]; Urges Congress to call a convention for the purpose of proposing amendments to the Constitution of the United States to provide for a balanced federal budget and limit the ability of Congress to dictate to states requirements for the expenditure of federal funds

HB 0025 **Relating to Temporary and Concurrent Custody of a Child** Glorioso

Temporary and Concurrent Custody of a Child: Provides that parent assigned to military service on orders in excess of specified period may designate person to exercise time-sharing on parent's behalf; limits who may be designated; provides for expedited hearings; requires servicemember & nonmilitary parent to cooperate to resolve issues & share information; revises provisions relating to petitions & court orders awarding temporary custody of child to extended family member, to also provide for concurrent custody with parents of child; revises petition for concurrent custody to require additional information; provides that if parent objects to petition for concurrent custody, court may not grant petition & must give petitioner option of converting petition to one for temporary custody; provides for dismissal of petition; provides that order granting concurrent custody does not affect ability of parents to obtain physical custody of child at any time; provides for court to terminate order for concurrent custody if either or both parents object to order; provides for filing for temporary custody if order for concurrent custody has been terminated; provides for modification of existing child support order. Effective Date: July 1, 2010

Public Education: Prohibits district school boards, administrative personnel, & instructional personnel from taking affirmative action that infringes or waives rights or freedoms afforded by First Amendment to United States Constitution in absence of certain consent. Effective Date: July 1, 2010

HB 0037 **Relating to Health Care Services** Plakon

Health Care Services: Proposes creation of s. 28, Art. I of State Constitution to prohibit laws or rules from compelling any person, employer, or health care provider to participate in any health care system, permit person or employer to purchase lawful health care services directly from health care provider, permit health care provider to accept direct payment from person or employer for lawful health care services, exempt persons, employers, & health care providers from penalties & fines for paying or accepting direct payment for lawful health care services, & permit purchase or sale of health insurance in private health care systems; specifies what amendment does not affect or prohibit. Effective Date: Not Specified

Civics Education: Designates act "Justice Sandra Day O'Connor Civics Education Act"; provides requirement that reading portion of language arts curriculum include civics education content for all grade levels; provides requirements for civics education course that student must successfully complete for middle grades promotion; requires administration of end-of-course assessment in civics education as field test at middle school level; provides requirements for course grade & course credit; requires inclusion of civics education end-of-course assessment data in determining school grades. Effective Date: July 1, 2010

HB 0119 Relating to Sexual Offenders and Predators

Glorioso

Sexual Offenders and Predators: Prohibits loitering or prowling by certain offenders within specified distance of places where children were congregating; prohibits certain actions toward child at public park or playground by certain offenders; prohibits presence of certain offenders at child care facility or pre- K through 12 school without notice & supervision; provides exceptions; provides penalties, etc.

Elections: Provides that all matters in chapters 97 through 105, F.S., are preempted to state, unless otherwise specified; defines term "absent uniformed services voter"; revises definition of term "overseas voter"; revises voter challenge oath requirements; provides circumstances under which challenged voter may execute change of legal residence, be directed to proper precinct, or vote provisional ballot, etc. Effective Date: May 28, 2010

SB 0140 Relating to School Food Service Programs

Siplin

School Food Service Programs [SPSC]; Creates the Florida Farm Fresh Schools Program within the DOE. Requires the department to work with the DOACS to develop policies that encourage school districts to buy fresh and local food and select foods with maximum nutritional content. Requires the DOE, in collaboration with the DOACS, to provide outreach services regarding the benefits of fresh food products from this state, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2010.

SB 0150 Relating to Athletic Coaches

Ring

Athletic Coaches [SPSC]; Requires the independent sanctioning authority of a youth athletic team to screen the background of current and prospective athletic coaches through designated state and federal sex offender registries. Requires the independent sanctioning authority to disqualify any athletic coach appearing on a registry. Requires said sanctioning authority to maintain documentation of screening results and disqualification notices, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2010.

SB 0166 **Relating to Prescribed Pancreatic Enzyme Supplements/Use** Wise
Prescribed Pancreatic Enzyme Supplements/Use [SPSC]; Authorizes certain K-12 students to use prescribed pancreatic enzyme supplements under certain circumstances. Requires the State Board of Education to adopt rules. Provides for indemnification. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2010.

District School Board Policies and Procedures [SPSC]; Provides legislative intent to recognize student academic achievement. Encourages each district school board to adopt policies and procedures that provide for an annual "Academic Scholarship Signing Day." EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2010.

SB 0434 **Relating to Suicide Prevention Education** Sobel
Suicide Prevention Education [SPSC]; Deletes references to inactive organizations represented by members of the Suicide Prevention Coordinating Council and replaces with active organizations. Requires that district school boards provide access to suicide prevention educational resources to all instructional and administrative personnel as part of the school district professional development system. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2010.

SB 0464 **Relating to Military Affairs/Leave of Absence** Fasano
Military Affairs/Leave of Absence [GPSC]; Amends specified provision relating to provisions authorizing leave of absence for officers and employees of the state or counties, municipalities, or political subdivisions who are commissioned reserve officers or reserve enlisted personnel in the United States military or naval service or who are members of the National Guard. Provides for the appointment of a second Assistant Adjutant General for the Florida National Guard Army, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2010.

Public K-12 Education: Provides that comprehensive health education taught in public schools shall include component on teen dating violence & abuse for students in grades 7 through 12; requires district school boards to adopt & implement dating violence & abuse policy; requires DOE to develop model policy; requires school personnel training. Effective Date: July 1, 2010

Tax on Sales, Use, and Other Transactions: Specifies period during which sale of books, clothing, & school supplies is exempt from tax. Effective Date: May 26, 2010

HB 0521 **Relating to Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children** Proctor

Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children: Abrogates future repeal of compact; deletes provisions relating to disclosure of information & records & closure of meetings by Interstate Commission on Educational Opportunity for Military Children; provides for future legislative review & repeal of compact. Effective Date: May 11, 2010

SB 0622 **Relating to Gaming** Jones (D)
Gaming [CPSC]; Amends specified provision relating to compact authorization. Provides that specified agreements executed by the Seminole Tribe of Florida and the Governor are void and not in effect. Ratifies and approves a specified compact executed by the Tribe and the Governor. Directs the Governor to cooperate with the Tribe in seeking approval of the compact from the United States Secretary of the Interior, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 04/28/2010.

HB 0663 **Relating to Building Safety** Aubuchon
Building Safety: Revises provisions of law relating to elevator safety, home inspection services, mold assessment & remediation, & building code inspections & enforcement; provides for effect of expired, lapsed, nonrenewed, or revoked building permit; revises Florida Building Commission authority; exempts specified structures from Florida Building Code requirements, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2010,

HB 0689 **Relating to Negligence** Aubuchon
Negligence: Provides that if person slips & falls on transitory foreign substance in business establishment, injured person must prove that establishment had actual or constructive knowledge of

condition & should have taken action to remedy it; provides that constructive knowledge may be proven by circumstantial evidence; provides that such provisions do not affect any common-law duty of care owed by person or entity in possession or control of business premises; repeals provisions relating to duty to maintain premises & burden of proof in claims of negligence involving transitory foreign objects or substances. Effective Date: July 1, 2010

HB 0723 **Relating to Postsecondary Education** Sachs
Postsecondary Education: Authorizes state universities & community colleges to waive tuition & fees for certain public school classroom teachers for undergraduate courses approved by DOE; requires State Board of Education rulemaking; prohibits cause of action against state university for actions or decisions of state university student government, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2010

HB 0747 **Relating to Treatment of Diabetes** Thompson (N)
Treatment of Diabetes: Revises Diabetes Advisory Council membership; prohibits school districts from restricting assignment of diabetic students to certain schools for certain reasons; authorizes student to manage diabetes while at school, at school-sponsored activities, or in transit to or from school or school-sponsored activities with written authorization from parent & physician; provides for indemnification of specified employees, volunteers, & entities. Effective Date: July 1, 2010

HB 0751 **Relating to Automatic Renewal of Service Contracts** McBurney
Automatic Renewal of Service Contracts: Requires sellers that sell, lease, or offer to sell or lease any services to consumers pursuant to certain contracts to disclose automatic renewal provisions; provides disclosure requirements; provides exceptions to disclosure requirements; provides that certain violations will render automatic renewal provision void & unenforceable; provides definitions & applicability. Effective Date: July 1, 2010, and applies only to contracts entered into on or after that date

HB 0787 **Relating to Child Abduction Prevention** Rouson
Child Abduction Prevention: Designates act "Child Abduction Prevention Act"; authorizes additional persons to move to have certain restrictions placed in parenting plans upon showing of risk that one party may violate court's parenting plan by removing child from this state or country or by concealing child's whereabouts; authorizes courts to impose certain restrictions in parenting plans upon specified finding; authorizes court to impose certain restrictions in addition to or in lieu of requirement that child's passport be surrendered; authorizes court to impose specified restrictions upon entry of order to prevent removal of child from this state or country; provides additional factors that may be considered in assessing risk that party may violate parenting plan by removing child from this state or country or by

concealing child's whereabouts; provides that violations may subject violator to specified penalties or other consequences. Effective Date: January 1, 2011

HB 0965 **Relating to Real Property Assessment** McKeel
Real Property Assessment: Requires property appraisers to adjust assessed value of specified properties affected by imported or domestic drywall; provides for nominal just value of \$0; provides for application to specified properties; provides for nonapplication to specified property owners; specifies homestead property as damaged for specified purposes; prohibits consideration of homestead property as abandoned under specified circumstances; provides for assessment of specified property after completion of remediation or repair; provides application to 2010 & subsequent assessment rolls; provides for future repeal unless reviewed & reenacted. Effective Date: June 1, 2010, and shall apply to the 2010 and subsequent assessment rolls

SB 1058 **Relating to Cooperation Between Schools & Juvenile Authorities** Aronberg
Cooperation Between Schools & Juvenile Authorities [SPSC]; Requires that specified school personnel be notified when a child of any age is formally charged by a state attorney with a felony or a delinquent act that would be a felony if committed by an adult and the disposition of the charges. Authorizes certain entities to release a student's education records without consent of the student or parent to parties to an interagency agreement for specified purposes, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2010.

Persons with Disabilities: Revises provisions relating to licensure & standards for facilities & programs for persons with developmental disabilities; requires minimum training for child care personnel to include identification & care of children with developmental disabilities; provides requirements for use of seclusion & restraint on public school students with disabilities; requires Commissioner of Education to develop recommendations to incorporate instruction relating to developmental disabilities into continuing education or inservice training requirements for instructional personnel, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2010

Firesafety Inspections [EPSC]; Provides exceptions to certain local government firesafety inspection

requirements. Specifies inspection requirements for fire hydrants owned by governmental entities. Authorizes local government utilities to comply using designated employees. Specifies responsibility for ensuring the qualification of designated employees to make inspections. EFFECTIVE DATE: 6/01/2010 6/1/2010 Approved by Governor; Chapter No. 2010-173

Local Government Prompt Payment Act: Revises definitions; revises provisions relating to timely payment for purchases of construction services; requires that dispute be resolved according to procedures in contract; prohibits assessment of damages against contractor if list of items remaining to complete is not timely provided to contractor; revises provisions relating to resolution of disputes concerning improper payment request or invoice; provides that local governmental entity waives its objection in payment dispute if it fails to commence dispute resolution procedure within time required. Effective Date: October 1, 2010

Cost-benefit/Return-on-investment/Dynamic Scoring [WPSC]; Authorizes the President of the Senate or the Speaker of the House of Representatives to request special impact sessions of consensus estimating conferences to evaluate proposed legislation based on specified techniques. Requires the Office of Economic and Demographic Research to develop protocols and procedures to be used by the consensus estimating conferences when evaluating proposed legislation, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 05/26/2010.

Assessment of Property for Back Ad Valorem Taxes: Provides for nonapplication of retroactive assessment & collection of ad valorem taxes on property under specified circumstances; provides criteria. Effective Date: July 1, 2010

Postsecondary Student Fees: Clarifies exemption from fee requirements provided for student who is or was at time he or she reached 18 years of age in custody of relative under Relative Caregiver Program or who was adopted from DCFS after specified date; provides that certain exemptions include fees associated with enrollment in career-preparatory instruction; deletes exemption associated with completion of college-level communication & computation skills testing program; provides that exemptions remain valid for specified time. Effective Date: July 1, 2010

SB 1412 Relating to Obsolete or Outdated Agency Plans/Reports/Programs

Haridopolos
