INDUSTRY CERTIFICATION

In line with Palm Beach County School District's mission statement, all students must **graduate college and career ready**.

At West Boca High, we offer **AP**, **AICE**, **dual enrollment and industry certification courses** in order ensure our students are prepared for college and/or a career upon graduation.

Students are encouraged to graduate with at least one industry certification. These certifications save students money in the workforce and also help build their resume.

ALL students must finish their community service hours by the end of junior year in order to have senior privilege senior year!!

AP Courses & Changes



College Board revamped its AP testing process.

The deadline to order tests was moved up.

As a result, students may not drop AP courses after October 13th or they will be subject to a \$40 obligation fee.



Accommodations for AP and AICE

Students with IEP or 504 plans have the option to take their AP and AICE exams with testing accommodations. This process is different than the process used for FSA or EOC and requires an application through College Board (AP) and/or Cambridge (AICE). If you have an IEP, 504 plan or use any school based accommodations then you are not automatically qualified to use test accommodations on AP or AICE exams. Therefore all students seeking to use accommodations on their exams must see Ms. Lombardi (IEP) or Ms. Wolfe (504) by the start of second quarter to begin the process.

Bright Futures Requirements Gold Seal Vocational

The GSV award may only be used at postsecondary institutions that offer an applied technology diploma, technical degree education program (associate in applied science or associate in science), or a career certificate program and not towards the completion of an associate in arts or a baccalaureate degree.

Initial Eligibility Requirements: (As determined by the Florida Department of Education.)

- 1. Submit the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) no later than August 31 after high school graduation.
- 2. Graduate with a standard Florida high school diploma or its equivalent.
- 3. Achieve the required weighted 3.0 GPA in the non-elective high school courses.
- Complete at least 3 full credits in a single Career and Technical Education program.
- 5. Achieve the required minimum 3.5 unweighted GPA in the single Career and Technical Education program.
- Complete at least 30 volunteer service hours, 100 paid work hours, or a combination that equals a minimum of 100 total hours.
- Achieve the required minimum scores on one of the college entrance exams per the chart below no later than August 31 of the year the student graduates from high school.

Initial Eligibility Requirements: (As determined by the Florida Department of Education.)

- Submit the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) no later than August 31 after high school graduation.
- Graduate with a standard high school diploma or its equivalent.
- Earn a minimum of 5 postsecondary credit hours through CAPE industry certifications that articulate for college credit.
- Complete at least 30 volunteer service hours, 100 paid work hours, or a combination that equals a minimum of 100 total hours.

Florida Legislative Changes

- Florida Academic Scholars 100% of tuition and applicable fees at a Florida public postsecondary institution
- Florida Medallion Scholars 75% of tuition and applicable fees at a Florida public postsecondary institution
- Students must earn either the required volunteer service, paid work hours, or the combination of 100 total hours
- Request your official single sitting test scores be sent to one of Florida's public colleges or state universities when registering for the ACT®, CLT®, or SAT®.
- The CLT® (Classic Learning Test) combined score is the sum of the best Verbal Reasoning, Grammar/Writing and Quantitative Reasoning from any test sitting of the CLT® for an Overall Score.
- Bright Futures awards are available for Florida Academic Scholars and Florida Medallion Scholars for the summer 2023 and summer 2024 terms.
- Beginning in the fall 2021, students enrolled in an associate degree program at a Florida public postsecondary institution will receive an award to cover 100% of tuition and applicable fees
- Applicable fees for both FAS and FMS include: activity and service fee, health fee, athletic fee, financial aid fee, capital improvement fee, campus access/transportation fee, technology fee and tuition differential fee.
- A student is eligible to apply for reinstatement for up to five years from high school graduation.



SAT/ACT Fee Waivers

Students who qualify for free or reduced lunch are eligible to receive 2 SAT fee waivers and up to 4 ACT waivers.

- An opportunity to earn BOTH high school and college credit for free!
- 3.0 cumulative unweighted GPA
- College ready test scores on the SAT, ACT, and/or PERT in ALL subject areas.
- Process: Check eligibility through SIS and counselor then go to website:

- Steps for Prospective Students-> Steps and Guidelines-> Apply, Set up Workday
 Student Account, Attend Orientation, Tell your counselor what class(es) you want to
 take. Counselor supplies Dual Enrollment Authorization Form.
- Books Students must supply a hard copy of their schedule to the Guidance assistant and a triplicate form is provided to bring to BookSmart to obtain text books.
