

Hello Parents and Guardians!

We want your child to be as successful as possible at school. Success in school is not just about reading and math. It is also about knowing how to learn and how to get along with others. In Classroom Guidance, we will be using the Second Step program to teach these critical skills. The Second Step program teaches skills in the following four areas: 1. Skills for Learning: Students gain skills to help themselves learn, including how to focus their attention. listen carefully, and be assertive when asking for help with schoolwork. 2. Empathy: Students learn to identify and understand their own and others' feelings. Students also learn how to take another's perspective and how to show compassion. 3. Emotion Management: Students learn specific skills for calming down when experiencing strong feelings, such as anxiety or anger. 4. Problem Solving: Students learn a process for solving problems with others in a positive way. Your child will be learning a lot this year—and he or she will need your help! If you have any questions about the Second Step program, please do not hesitate to contact us for more information. 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Kindergarten:

It is hard to believe that November is here! As the leaves begin to change colors and fall from the trees, our Kindergarteners are falling for books! The process of learning to read continues to be the biggest goal for our students. As your child continues to learn and apply each new strategy to his or her reading, an amazing change takes place! The confidence of your child grows and changes and the desire to read becomes a priority for each child. Reading to your child and listening to them read to you each day sends them the message that reading is important to both of you! In math, we are introducing Addition to the sum of 10.

First Grade:

Hello first grade families, the first trimester is almost over!! Just a reminder, report cards will be in your child's portal tile under SIS (no hard copy). Please make sure your email address and phone numbers are updated. We want to make sure you're receiving all important calls and emails. Thank you for your support. We are so PROUD of all the hard work they are doing! In ELA we will begin Unit 3 in Benchmark: Being a Good Community Member. Students will read a variety of genres including: nonfiction, poetry, realistic fiction, and biographies. We will also be writing expository texts, which is research (main idea) and information (details) about a topic. At home, read/listen to a book for at least 15 minutes every day. In Math, we are going to work in Unit 5: Understanding the Meaning of an Equal Sign. At home, practice addition and subtraction facts and strategies to 20 and memorize the doubles facts. In Science, we will be in Unit 3: Needs of Living Things. At home, discuss the basic needs of animals/plants and what they need to survive. In Social Studies, we are continuing with Unit 2: Civics and Government. At home, talk about American Symbols, for example: bald eagle, flag. Statue of Liberty, etc...

Second Grade:

Happy November everyone! We cannot believe we are already in the second trimester of an incredible year. This month we have some very exciting events. We cannot wait for our field trip to the science museum on November 17th where we will discover more information about how we move our bodies. This month we are working on double digit subtraction and have been learning many methods to solve problems. In reading, we have been working on unit 3 which is all about government workers and the importance of having a government with rules to keep us safe. Ask your child what a smoke jumper does! Please continue to check blue communication folders for important events and homework. Do not forget about Thanksgiving break, we will be off November 20th – November 24th. Ms. Tringali, Ms. Roseman, Ms. Howard, Ms. Zdzieba, Ms. Willians, and Ms. Allegro want to wish you all a happy thanksgiving. We are all thankful for your students!!

Hello 3rd Grade Families!




Fourth Grade:
