Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

Students are supervised on-campus from 7:50AM until 4:15PM daily. Students may not enter campus prior to 7:50AM. The Burt Reynolds parent drop-off gate is located off of Sapodilla and is open from 7:50AM until 8:30AM and from 3:40PM until 4:15PM daily. Between the school hours of 8:30AM and 3:40PM, the only accessible, supervised entrance to campus is off Fern St.

Students must stay on campus once they have arrived in the morning, no student should be exiting campus.





Early Dismissal Procedures

Students may be signed out for early dismissal between the hours of 8:30 am and 3:15 pm. There will be no dismissals made after 3:15 pm.

- 1. A parent/guardian must email <u>dsoastudentservices@palmbeachschools.org</u> to report the early dismissal. The email must come from a parent/guardian's email that is already in SIS. In the request, the parent/guardian must include the following information: student name, student ID number, time for early dismissal, reason for early dismissal, mode of transportation to leave campus, and name of emergency contact who is authorized to pick up the student. Students will only be released into the care of a contact that is listed as the emergency contact on the student's SIS screen.
- 2. A printed pass will be in Student Services for the student to pick up. This pass allows them to leave their class AND leave the campus as passes must be presented at the gate.
- 3. Student drivers may not leave early unless their parent/guardian has emailed the school. Student drivers must report to Student Services to pick up their dismissal pass before exiting the building to their car. This pass will be shown at the gate to allow exit. Students may not ride with other students for early dismissal.

*Students with dual enrollment, executive internship, senior privilege, etc. will be required to show their ID and schedule at the gate before leaving school grounds.


No student may leave early with another student, even if the student is 18 years old. Students that are under the age of 18 must be picked up by an adult that is on their contact list on SIS, unless the student drove themselves to school. When picking up, please be ready to show your ID at Students Services. Safety is a top priority for us here at Dreyfoos and we want to ensure that all students are accounted for each day.





Bullying is an unacceptable behavior that adults and students have a responsibility to stop. If you or someone you know is a target of bullying, abuse, mistreatment, harassment, threat, or intimidation, let us know the name of your school and as many specifics of the situation as possible. Reporting is not tattling when the intention is to alert the teacher and/or administration of any harmful acts of mistreatment toward your child or others. What you should do if your child is bullied:

- Focus on your child. Listen, be supportive, and gather information and the facts related to the incident.
- Stay calm and report the incident to your child's teacher, school counselor, assistant principal, and/or principal. Document all incidents of mistreatment, abuse, cruelty, and/or disrespectful acts towards your child.
- Complete and/or encourage your child to file the Student Bullying and Harassment Report found in the main office of your school and place it in the Drop Box or complete the online <u>Bullying and Harassment Form</u>. Reporting is not tattling when the intention is to alert the teacher and/or administration of any harmful acts of mistreatment toward your child or others.
- Call Safe Schools' centralized Bullying Anonymous Hotline Telephone to report concerns of bullying (561) 434-8200.
- Request that you be informed or schedule a follow-up conference to discuss findings and determine actions to monitor and support all students involved, as well as to deter continued and/or escalation of incidents.
- Seek resources to assist you in strengthening your child's resiliency toward harm.



In collaboration with the state of Florida, the School District of Palm Beach County is rolling out one more way to keep your children safe at school. Students, parents, community members, and school District staff are encouraged to download the FortifyFL app. FortifyFL is a suspicious activity reporting tool that allows you to instantly relay information to appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials.

Making a threat on social media is a crime and is considered a second-degree felony in Florida. Threats made toward schools, regardless of the severity of the threat, will be taken seriously by authorities. The app is quick and easy to navigate. Users can provide a description of the threat, as well as share pictures and videos all while remaining anonymous. Tips are reported to school administrators, school police, local law enforcement, and state investigators.

Closed Campus

The School of the Arts is a closed campus, in order to satisfy State and School Board requirements (FS 230.22,22; FS 230.12,6,c.) for supervision of students.

- 1. All students, regardless of age, are not permitted to leave the campus during the school day without written permission from parent/guardian and administration.
- 2. Early Release: In order to ensure student safety, students may only be released from school early into the care of an authorized emergency contact on the student's SIS screen. If the student is authorized to park on campus and has a notarized parking permit for students form on file, they may be released to drive off-campus for early release. Students may NOT ride with another student for early dismissal, regardless of the students' respective ages. Students may not take an early Tri-rail train home and may not walk off-campus for early dismissal.
- 3. During lunch, students must remain in the assigned eating area. All other portions of the campus are off-limits. Food deliveries are not permitted. Leaving campus for lunch is not permitted unless it is part of an approved DSOA activity. In the case of an approved off-campus lunch activity, a notarized parent/guardian approval form must be on file with the school.
- 4. Students are not permitted to bring or invite friends onto the campus during school hours for any reason.
- 5. All campus perimeter gates are closed at 8:30 am for safety purposes. The single point of entry during the school day is the entrance off Fern St.
- 6. Those students who have a free period at the end of the day and need to return to campus after school for a rehearsal, audition, athletic competition or other school activity, may not return to campus until 4PM in order to avoid congestion in the parking lot during dismissal.

Parent/Teacher Communication and Conferences

The following protocol is required when communication is necessary between home and school. The steps are as follows:

The parent and/or teacher will establish the first line of communication between the teacher and home.

Parents should email the teacher, as this is the most efficient type of communication.

Teachers emails are always in the following format: firstname.lastname@palmbeachschools.org

If necessary, the parent/guardian and/or teacher will contact the school counselor for assistance via email.

If necessary, or in extenuating circumstances, the parent or student will contact the assistant principal.

If necessary, the school counselor or assistant principal will schedule a parent-teacher conference in which the assigned assistant principal and/or school counselor will attend.



Locker Sales

- 1. All lockers will be assigned on a rental basis. Students will be allowed to select the locker of their choice. The rental fee for each locker, for the entire school year, is \$20. Lockers may be rented in the Magnet Office. Please bring the building # and locker # with you for purchase.
- 2. No personally owned locks may be secured to any locker. Students who place personal locks on lockers will be in violation of school policy and subject to disciplinary action. In addition, a personal lock may be cut off, as the identity of its owner may be unknown.
- 3. Students are advised not to divulge the combination of their locks to any other student. Locker sharing is NOT PERMITTED. The student on record for renting the locker is subject to disciplinary action if anything that violates the SDPBC Code of Conduct is found in the locker.
- 4. Writing on or marking any locker is considered defacing of school property and is subject to disciplinary action.
- 5. School-provided locks will already be on each locker. When students go to the Magnet Office in building 2 to purchase a locker, the locker will be recorded for that particular student's use for that school year only. Students will be provided the combination to the lock on the locker of their choosing at the time of purchase.
- 6. Student lockers must be emptied of all personal belongings on or before the last day of student attendance.

Exam Information

For the 2023-2024 school year, semester exams will take place on December 19th, 20th, 21st, 22nd. Final exams will take place on May 24th, 28th, 29th, 30th. Exams cannot be given early. Please do not plan vacations on these dates as student absences impact success.

Senior Yearbook Photos

Make sure your senior takes (or retakes) his or her formal senior pictures for the yearbook this summer! The HJ Photo Studio on Dixie Highway in Lake Worth is open for our students. If a student doesn't like their photo taken on campus in May, there is no charge to retake the photo. Additional photo packages are also available. This will be the picture of the student for the yearbook so be sure to make your appointment soon at HJPalmBeach.com. Spots will fill up so please book now! All seniors must have their photos taken before September 30.

Discipline

When students accepted their seat to DSOA, they signed a contract promising to maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or greater and a semester arts HPA of 3.0 or greater. In addition, students agreed to attend classes regularly and promptly, and adhere to the code of student conduct. Failure to adhere to any of these responsibilities may result in a student being placed on probation. If the terms of the contract are still not met in a subsequent semester, the student may be recommended for exit from DSOA at the end of that semester. Students who are found to commit a level 3 or 4 incident, as indicated by the SDPBC Student Code of Conduct, will immediately be considered for a possible dismissal from DSOA, regardless of the time in the school calendar that the infraction occurs. Students who are exited from DSOA must return to their home school or an alternative school, as appropriate. Please reference the full SDPBC Student Code of Conduct available on the school district website for a listing of level 1 through 4 discipline that could impact a student's enrollment here at DSOA.

Student Devices

All students will be required to check out a SDPBC Chromebook or school-issued CTE laptop (CTE laptops are only issued to students enrolled in specific courses). If students bring their own personal device, the school and district are not responsible for any damages or loss that may occur. If students choose to bring their own device, they must also bring the school-issued device. The school device is required for all classroom-based assessments, state testing, etc. If the school-issue device is lost or damaged, the student will be financially assessed appropriately and placed on an obligation list for the appropriate fee until the fee is paid. All obligations must be financially cleared prior to graduation.

Student Lunch

School breakfast and lunches are free to all students. However, students may purchase à la carte items. Parents may utilize School Cash Online (schoolcashonline.com) to add money to lunch accounts. The cafeteria will not "credit" lunches, meaning students cannot have a negative balance in their lunch accounts. Checks should be made out to Dreyfoos School of the Arts. The cafeteria cannot accept any bill larger than a \$50 bill. Breakfast is free to all students. Although lunch is free, students are encouraged to apply for free or reduced lunch. If you would like to apply, go to the School District Food Service website, https://www.myschoolapps.com/Home/PickDistrict, to apply for free or reduced lunch benefits.

Lunch at Dreyfoos is from 11:19-12:06 every day.



Student Attendance

Absence Limits:

Six (6) or more absences in a block class (1st, 2nd, 4th, 5th, 6th, or 7th period) each semester will require a student to demonstrate mastery on an exam to receive credit for that class. Eleven (11) or more absences in a non-block class (third period) each semester will require a student to demonstrate mastery on an exam to receive credit for that class.

Discrepancies in Attendance:

The School District of Palm Beach County has an automated attendance calling system that will call parents/guardians when the student has been marked absent from one or more periods each day. Please note that the system cannot distinguish between an unexcused or excused absence; only that the student has been marked absent. If a parent/guardian is aware of the student's absence, they do not have to call the number the recording has provided. That number is for parents/guardians who were not aware that their student had been marked absent. Should a student or parent/guardian have a question regarding an absence, the student needs to do the following:

- 1. If there is a discrepancy in attendance, email the teacher directly.
- 2. Ask the teacher to email Michelle Rodriguez to correct the error in attendance.
- 3. Parent/guardian needs to email <u>dsoastudentservices@palmbeachschools.org</u> to designate the absence as excused.

How to Document Absences & Access Assignments:

- 1.A parent/guardian must contact the DSOA student services office at <u>dsoastudentservices@palmbeachschools.org</u>. If the parent desires, they may also email the student's teachers. If the absence is going to be long-term due to illness, please email the counselor.
- 2.The parent/guardian or the student should notify their teachers of the absence via email and access any assignments needed off Google Classroom. If hard copies are required, the teacher should be provided 2 business days to submit the needed documents to student services for pick up.
- 3. If needed, the school counselor will collaborate with the family and needed staff to provide the necessary support for the duration of the absences.







Dress Code Information

To create the best learning environment for District students, the District-Wide Dress Code must be observed in all District schools. This Code provides a minimal district-wide dress code, which should apply even if a school implements a School Specific (Standard) School Dress Code or Higher Standard (Uniform) Dress Code as provided in this policy. Specifically, the following attire is unacceptable in District schools:

- i. Attire with language or images that are crude, vulgar, profane, lewd/obscene, sexually explicit, or sexually suggestive.
- ii. Attire with symbols, mottoes, words or acronyms that promote illegal or violent conduct, such as gang symbols, the unlawful use of weapons, drugs, alcohol, tobacco, or drug paraphernalia, or clothing that contains threats.
- iii. Attire associated with discrimination on the basis of age, color, handicap, national origin, sexual orientation, marital status, race, religion, or sex.
- iv. Clothing traditionally designed as undergarments, such as boxer shorts or sleepwear, may not be worn as outer garments.
- v. Clothing that is sexually suggestive or revealing (examples include, but are not limited to, clothing which exposes the midriff, exposes one's undergarments, has plunging necklines, muscle tops, backless clothing, and are constructed of see-through materials).
- vi. Attire that may be used as a weapon, including but not limited to, steel toed shoes; large, long, or heavy waist or other chains; studded or chained accessories; items with spikes; and other items deemed inappropriate by an individual school site.
- vii. Articles of clothing that cause excessive maintenance problems for school property, such as, shoe cleats that scratch floors or tear rugs, trousers with metal rivets that scratch furniture, etc. viii. Clothing which, because of fit, design, color, texture, inadequate coverage, or some other factor, creates classroom or school disorder or distracts the attention of another student or students in any class in session from the lesson being presented or from any other assigned school activity, or which creates a safety or health hazard for any student in the school.
- ix. Jewelry worn in a manner that presents a safety health hazard or causes a major disruption to the educational process. Examples may be chains hanging from the belt pocket or attached to the wallet.
- x. Footwear which does not provide adequate protection or hygienic measures.
- xi. A student who fails to maintain personal cleanliness, grooming, or neatness of dress to the extent that presence in the classroom creates classroom or school disorder or distracts the attention of others from assigned classroom activity will be required to maintain a level of personal cleanliness, grooming, or neatness of dress that eliminates the disorder or the distraction of other students in the classroom.
