



What is Dual Enrollment?

- Students may take in-person or online courses at <u>Florida Atlantic University</u> (FAU) or <u>Palm Beach</u> <u>State College</u> (PBSC) or <u>online courses at UF</u>
- Courses count for high school credit AND college credit
- Grades are recorded on high school transcripts
 AND college transcripts
- The school district pays tuition and book fees!
- UF's online DE program is for juniors and seniors with a 3.6 GPA; if interested, contact your counselor



Dual Enrollment Requirements: PBSC

- 3.0 GPA (unweighted)
- College ready test scores for certain courses (different tests may be combined); check the <u>course catalog</u> for test requirements:
 - SAT or PSAT (prior to 6/2023): 24 Reading, 25 Writing and Language, 24 Math
 - SAT or PSAT (after 6/2023): 490 Evidenced-Based Reading and Writing, 480 Math
 - ACT: 19 Reading, 17 English, 19 Math
 - PERT: 106 Reading, 103 Writing, 114 Math
 - Next Gen Accuplacer: 245 Reading, 245 Writing, 242 Math
 - CLT: 38 Reading/Writing, 16 Math
- Certain courses do not have a test score requirement!
- Student and parent must sign and abide by the dual enrollment agreement (<u>ACHS Dual Enrollment</u>)
- Students must attend a virtual information/advising session and sign the PBSC agreement (first time DE students only)



Dual Enrollment Requirements: FAU

- 3.0 GPA (unweighted)
- College ready test scores:
 - SAT: 490 Evidenced-Based Reading and Writing, 480 Math
 - ACT: 19 Reading, 17 English, 19 Math
 - PERT: 106 Reading, 103 Writing, 114 Math
 - Next Gen Accuplacer: 245 Reading, 245 Writing, 242 Math
 - CLT: 38 Reading/Writing, 16 Math
 - Student and parent must sign and abide by the dual enrollment agreement (ACHS Dual Enrollment)



Dual Enrollment (DE) Agreement

- DE grades are a permanent part of the high school AND college transcripts
- Students may take a maximum of 8 credits (2 courses) per semester
- Students who earn a D, F, or W (withdraw) are no longer eligible for DE; however, PBSC allows students to petition for reinstatement after sitting out for 1 semester
- Attendance is mandatory and students can be withdrawn for non-attendance
- Students are responsible for their own transportation for in-person classes



Dual Enrollment (DE) Agreement

- Students will receive a book voucher and MUST return books at the end of the semester to avoid being placed on obligation
- DE students MUST follow the college's rules, regulations, codes of conduct, and academic expectations
- Students are responsible for communicating with their college professor re: grades
- There is NO SIS Gateway in college and parents do not have access to grades, assignments, conferences, etc.



Steps to Dual Enrollment: PBSC

- Follow the <u>DE checklist</u>.
- Apply for admission.
- If you do not have PSAT/SAT/ACT scores and you wish to take a course with a test score requirement, <u>register for a</u> <u>PERT test</u> (it's free the first time at PBSC).
- Complete the <u>online dual enrollment orientation</u> and sign the PBSC agreement.
- View the <u>online course catalog</u> and <u>schedule</u> and select your course(s) plus alternates; be aware of DAYS and TIMES offered to avoid conflict with your Atlantic schedule.
- Email your counselor with your signed Atlantic DE agreement, test scores if applicable (no need to send if your scores are on SIS), and list of chosen courses plus alternates.



Steps to Dual Enrollment: PBSC

- Your counselor will send you a DE authorization form, proof of your GPA, and test scores if on SIS.
- Submit your PBSC agreement, DE authorization form, test scores, and proof of your GPA to PBSC via your Workday account.
- Register for your course(s) on your Workday account after you receive a confirmation email from PBSC.
- Show your counselor a screenshot of your PBSC schedule to receive a book voucher. Take the voucher and show your schedule at <u>Booksmart</u> to obtain your books free of charge.
- After your course ends, RETURN your book(s) to Booksmart and email a picture of your receipt to <u>your</u> <u>counselor</u> or <u>Mrs. Andreula</u>.



PBSC Dual Enrollment at Atlantic High

- We offer DE courses on campus at Atlantic High!
 - HSC 2100: Health Concepts and Strategies with Ms. Taback
 - passing reading & writing/English scores
 - ☐ **SLS1501**: Introduction to the College Experience with Ms. Jones
 - test scores are not required
- The same DE eligibility requirements, expectations, and enrollment process applies to these courses
- If you are interested for next school year, please ask your counselor during course selection



Steps to Dual Enrollment: FAU

- FAU Dual Enrollment
- Complete the <u>non-degree application</u> online
- If you do not have passing SAT/ACT scores, register for the <u>Accuplacer</u>
- View the <u>online course catalog</u> and select your course(s) plus alternates; check the <u>schedule</u> and be aware of DAYS and TIMES offered to avoid conflict with your Atlantic schedule
- Complete your own <u>permission and registration form</u>
- Email your counselor with signed Atlantic DE agreement, test scores (no need to send if your scores are on SIS), and completed permission form signed by you and your parent



Steps to Dual Enrollment: FAU

- Your counselor will sign and return the permission form, proof of GPA, and test scores if on SIS
- Email your permission form, GPA, and test scores to hsdual@fau.edu
- Register for your course(s) online via your FAU student account
- Show your counselor a screenshot of your PBSC schedule to receive a book voucher. Take the voucher and show your schedule at <u>Booksmart</u> to obtain your books free of charge.
- After your course ends, RETURN your book(s) to Booksmart and email a picture of your receipt to <u>your</u> <u>counselor</u> or <u>Mrs. Andreula</u>.



FAU Special DE Programs

- Climate READY: 5 day summer residential program, costs \$975 + ID card and transportation fees
- H2O Connections: 5 day summer residential program, costs \$975 + ID card and transportation fees
- <u>Pine Jog Fellowship</u>: 2 semester program, costs \$150 +
 ID card and transportation fees

These programs provide unique opportunities to earn dual enrollment credits.

If the cost for these programs is not affordable, students may take any dual enrollment eligible course at FAU, PBSC, or UF for free!
