#### Profile: Information about yourself

- Contacts
  - Phone number, mailing address
- Demographics
  - Religion, military service, race/ethnicity (all optional)
- Geography
  - Birthplace, countries lived in, language proficiency, citizenship

# Family: Information about your family

- Household
  - Parent marital status, parent(s) with whom you reside
- Parent and/or Guardian
  - Name, birthplace, occupation, education, stepparent information
- Siblings
  - Age, grade, education

#### Education: High School Information

- School
  - Current school, dates attended, counselor name (Dean), phone, and email
- History
  - Previous schools, dates attended, education progression changes (time off, early graduation, gap year, etc.), college courses, college assistance programs
- Academic Information
  - GPA, class rank, current year courses, honors and awards

# Testing: Official Standardized Test Scores

- College Entrance
  - ACT and SAT
- English For Non-Native Speakers TOEFL, IELTS, PTE Academic
- Academic Subjects
  - AP, IB, SAT Subject Tests, A-Levels
- Other
  - Optional reporting for other relevant 9-12 testing

# Activities: Principal Activities/Work (max of 10)

- Years of participation
- Hours per week
- Weeks per year
- Position/leadership held, brief description

# Writing: Essay, Discipline, Additional Information

- Personal Essay 650 words maximum
   Select one of seven prompts (available in C&C)
- Disciplinary History
   Explanations regarding school discipline and misdemeanor or felony convictions
- Additional Information
   Relevant circumstances/qualifications not reflected elsewhere

#### Courses & Grades: Transcript

• Your complete academic record for grades 9-12, if required by college

- General
  - Entry term, degree status, housing preference, test-optional preference, scholarship and financial aid preference
- Academics
   Academic interest, program(s) applying to
- Additional questions

# College Writing Supplements: Additional Essay(s)

Additional short answer or essay responses requested by some colleges

# My College's Tab: Add your colleges

- Search for the school using the available search criteria
- In the Results List, check the box besides the college name
- Click the "Add" button at the bottom right of the page
- Once you've added the schools you are applying to, check to see what other information each school requires
- FERPA release authorization
   Must complete to allow transcripts and recommendations to be
   submitted on your behalf
- Invite Recommenders name and email needed
   Add Counselors (your Dean), Teachers, and/or other recommenders to your "Invite and Manage Recommenders" list
- You must assign the recommenders a college for them to receive an email. Select their name from the dropdown menu and use the assign button
- Check the information for each college as requirements may differ
- Be sure to check the status of your recommenders

  - \*How to create or link your SSAR (if one is needed)
