Dear Parents/Guardians:

Well the Holiday Season is here – Thanksgiving brings the sprint to all the other holidays. Time truly seems to go faster and faster every day!! Many exciting events occurred at Freedom Shores. We had our ESOL Parent Night, Literacy Night, the First Grade Literacy Breakfast and the Coral Reef Scavenger Hunt for our Pre-K children. We then transitioned into our second round of State Testing.

During our ESOL Parent Night, many families came out to our school in order to develop a better understanding of the services that their children are receiving during the day at school. Our ESOL team presented all the various strategies and skills that are covered during their day in school. At our Literacy Night, each grade level presented activities that could be taken home that night and utilized to work at home on the children's reading skills. Our First Grade team conducted the second Literacy Breakfast of the year. They presented skills that could be used while reading at home with your children. Everyone who attended also receive a copy of the book that was modeled. Our VPK classroom hosted a Coral Reef Scavenger Hunt, which had the children giving hints to the adults about various creatures that live in coral reefs. The coral reef was built by the students and displayed in the hallway.

In our classrooms, many engaging lessons took place on the carpets and projects were being completed in small groups to give the students the most effective instruction possible. Our teachers were best preparing the students for the upcoming second State Assessment.

During morning drop-off, please remember to have your children ready to exit the car on the passenger side of the car, when you pull up in front of the school. By doing this and by pulling up as far as you can on the curb we will continue to make our drop-off procedure faster. As long as you are in the school gates by 8:00 your child is not late. If you come in after 8:00, you will need to park and sign your child in. 

ZONES

The Zones of Regulation is a complete social-emotional learning curriculum, created to teach children self-regulation and emotional control. At Freedom Shores we utilize this curriculum in our Emotional Behavioral classroom but it can be used anywhere including home! The most important component of this unit is teaching students to recognize what they are feeling and how to cope with those feelings (develop a plan to move to another zone). We often tell students- Feelings ARE OKAY! It is what you do with them that matters.

Dual Language & Esol



Last month the ESOL Team held the first Parent Leadership Council Meeting for this school year. Many parents attended and benefited from a variety of information about the ESOL/Dual Language Program, parent/student resources and Choice Programs. They were also given homework, study tips and literacy activities to do at home with their child.



The testing window for ACCESS begins on January 22nd and ends on March 15th. All ELL K-5 students will take the ACCESS language proficiency test during this time period. The test measures the student's progress in listening, speaking, reading and writing. Individual student report scores will be sent home at a later date. More information will be coming soon.

DL parent's please join us to our first in house District Dual Language Parent Series workshop on December, 7 starting promptly at 8:30 am-10:00 am. The District Dual Language Team is pleased to announce its ongoing commitment to engaging parents through a comprehensive four-part series of workshops. The first workshop, centered around providing parents with foundational knowledge about Dual Language Immersion, is already underway. Our second installment in the series will concentrate on the topics of bilingualism and biliteracy, and further details about this session will be unveiled in January.

CHOICE PROGRAM

The Choice Program is a specialized educational program that enables students to take advantage of additional sources and instruction that focus on the child's individual talent or interest. Some of these schools offer instruction in the area of technology, healthcare, dual language, art, drama, music, dance etc. If your child has a special interest or skill, your child may be a good candidate to attend the schools offering the **Choice Program. The** applications are available in **English, Spanish, Creole and Portuguese on the District** website. The deadline to apply is December 8, 2023 for BAK Middle School and January 26, 2024 for all other schools. Talk with your fifth grader about the Choice Programs. Kindergarten:

At school, your child is engaging in Heggerty Phonemic Awareness lessons. Your child has worked with larger parts of words (compound words, syllables, and onset-rime), and now over the next couple of weeks our lessons will shift to listening for individual sounds, or phonemes. Phonemic awareness teaches students to hear individual sounds in words, and this supports the development of strong reading and writing skills. "Phonemic awareness has been shown to be a very powerful predictor of later reading achievement. Here are some fun activities to do together:

- Can you blend (put together) two sounds to make a word? For example, m $\bar{e} \rightarrow me$. \check{a} t \rightarrow at. n $\bar{o} \rightarrow mo$
- Guess Who Game (from Phonemic Awareness in Young Children). Say, "Guess whose name I am going to say" and then say just the first sound of the name. Have your child guess the name based on that first sound.
 Example: "Guess whose name I am going to say... /d/, /d/, /d/..." and they would say "dad!"
- When you say a word, you can add a sound to a word part to make a new word. Tell your child: "say -ate, add /g/ to the beginning and the word is...." and your child would say: "gate". Other words to use:

 -eep, add /k/ to the beginning >> keep = -et, add /j/ to the beginning >> jet
- When you say a word, you can also delete (or take away) the first sound. Say, " gate; without /g/, what's left is?" and your child would say: "ate"
- Books to read and enjoy together Chicka Chicka Boom Boom by Bill Martin Jr and J. Archambault and One
 Duck Stuck by Phyllis Root

First Grade:

Hello 1st Grade Families! December is here and 2023 is quickly coming to a close!! Have your child read every night and review the high frequency words! Please check your child's folder every day /night to see if there is any important information you need to know. In reading, we will be starting Unit 4: Stories Have A Narrator. Our focus will be on fiction stories. We will be writing our opinions about a topic with a sense of closure. At home after reading, describe the main story elements, ask questions and create mental images. Then, we will begin Unit 5: Technology and Society: Technology at Work. At home, read fiction/nonfiction texts. Ask your child questions about what they've read. In math, we are in Unit 6: Representing and Interpreting Data. and then quickly moving onto Unit 7: Extend the Counting Sequence. At home, review how to fluently add and subtract within 20, and count by 2's, 5's and 10's up to 100. In science, we will be focusing on Life Cycles, then Matter and Its Properties. Be on the lookout for STEM night! At home, describe how things are alike/different. Also, observe, describe and identify different objects. In social studies, we will be learning about holidays around the world. Then, we will be in Unit 3: Geography. At home, talk about maps, globes, and where they are from. If you ever have any questions or concerns, please reach out to us. We are here for you! Thank you for all your support! We want to send warm holiday wishes to you and your family. Have a happy, healthy, and safe new year! See you in 2024!!!

Second Grade:

Happy new year from second grade! We hope everyone had a relaxing break and a happy holiday! We had so much fun on our field trip to the Kravis Center to see the Nutcracker, the kids absolutely loved the performance. Right before break, we completed our second round of iReady diagnostics as well as our second round of FAST tests. We have loved seeing how much our scores have improved! Everyone has been tracking their results and setting goals to improve. We can't wait to jump into 2024 to grow even more as learners!

Third Grade:

Hello, 3rd Grade families! We just started our new reading unit called "Comparing Points of Views." Students are reading to answer the essential question "What makes people view the same experience differently?". They are learning how the narrator and the characters in a story have different perspectives or ways of looking at the story's events. Please continue encouraging your child to read every night as they will be using their skills when they take the F.A.S.T. ELA PM2 on Friday, December 8.

In math, students are learning how to Add Multi-Digit Whole Numbers. Please continue to monitor their homework and tests, as these skills will be assessed on their F.A.S.T. PM2 on Wednesday, December 13.

Lastly, please check your child's communication folder and agenda nightly. As the winter break quickly approaches, we would like to wish everyone a wonderful holiday season and a happy and healthy New Year.

Fourth Grade:

Big updates before our next big break!! Take a look at what's coming up this December/January. 
