Istation Awards – We have begun recognizing students from K – 5 for their academic achievement on Istation. Students that are **below** Tier 1 should be working on Istation at least 40 – 60 minutes a week, and this should be worked on at home in addition to the classroom.

Do you know what tier your child is on? If not, there are two easy ways to find out! First, ask your child's Spanish teacher or as a parent of a student in the Dual Language program, you have access to the online Istation Parent Portal!

Istation Parent Portal - To begin, go

to https://www.istation.com/istationhome. The first time you log in, you will be prompted to select your student's school. Type in the school information. (This will only be done once.) Then, type in your student's login information as provided by your teacher and click Log In. This Login is different from the school district login. 1st Grade News - February may be short, but it is filled with topics, themes, and celebrations that will keep us busy all month long! Let's Stay Connected...check in with your child's teacher if you have any questions or concerns. Look in your child's communication folder every night and clean it out. In reading, we are focusing on Technology at Work. We will answer the question: How can technology make a difference in our lives? In writing, we are focusing on the expository process. We are writing about technology in our homes. In math, we will be learning about how to compose two-digit numbers. In social studies, we will be learning about: saving and buying. In science, the big idea is: Matter in Motion. The essential question is, "How do objects move?" SCIENCE NIGHT was a huge success, thank you for those that attended. Please continue to read with your child every night and ask them what they are learning in school!

2nd Grade News – Hello Parents, Cool weather is here, and we ask that parents be sure to send their children to school properly dressed for outside recess. Also, during this month, our students will be celebrating Black History Month. This is a month to remember Africans' achievements and recognize the central role they have played in the history of the United States. Please, remember that your child should be reading at least 20 minutes per day.

3rd Grade News – Happy February, Freedom Shores Families! 3rd grade has SOARed into 2022! We are setting goals and continuing to monitor progress towards them. All students need 45 min. and 0.03 gains for Successmaker Math & 45 min. and 70%+ accuracy for iReady Reading, weekly. Their success in reaching these goals is being encouraged and celebrated! Teachers and students are monitoring this growth as we track progress. Writers are practicing and planning for informative prompts in response to texts they read. In Reading, we are determining a character's point of view through Stories Old and New: Exploring Genres of Fiction! During Math, we are working to understand fractions. We're looking forward to seeing you on Math Night: Wednesday, February 16th! In Social Studies, 3rd graders will study Black History this month. During this time, students are invited to learn about African American inventors, scientists, athletes, entertainers, and the rich history of African American culture. Please remember to check the blue communication folder for homework and sign your child's

agenda each day. Thank you so much for your continued support from home, it's appreciated!

4th Grade News -Hello fourth grade families!! February is Black History Month, which we will have ongoing activities and lessons about throughout the day. Be sure to ask your child who or what they've learned about each day! Wednesday, February 16 we will have our first ever-Real Life Math event here at FSE; hope to see everyone there! Friday, February 18th, students will have the chance to buy Kona Ice during recess again. Also, remember to check agendas daily for homework and parent/teacher communication.
