
After School Program





ACCESS TESTING

ACCESS Testing- Testing continues this month. All ELL students K-5 will be taking the ACCESS test between January 22nd -March 15th. If you have any questions, please contact Ms. Coffman- 804-3109.



Istation Awards – We have begun recognizing students from K – 5 by featuring them on The Istation Board for their achievement.

Students that were on Tier 1 or improved their tier during the month, received an award. Students that are below Tier 1 should be working on Istation at least 45 – 60 minutes a week, and this should be worked on at home in addition to the classroom.

Istation Parent Portal - Do you know what tier your child is on? If not, there are two easy ways to find out! First, ask your child's Spanish teacher or as a parent of a student in the Dual Language program, you have access to the online Istation Parent Portal!

To begin, go to

https://www.istation.com/istationhome. The first time you log in, you will be prompted to select your student's school. Type in the school information. (This will only be done once.) Then, type in your student's login information as provided by your teacher and click Log In. This Login is different from the school district login. If you need help or have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask your child's Spanish teacher or Ms. Concepcion at

Kindergarten:

Hooray, our fabulous kindergarteners are just over a 100 days SMARTER! As readers we are continuously practicing and using the skill of decoding to read words. This means that students are thinking about what they are reading and checking to make sure that what they read matches the words on the page. This also includes recognizing any errors made and fixing them right away when reading. When reading students are not only self-correcting but also making sense of and understanding the story. This month we will focus on learning new sounds to apply when reading. In writing our young authors are working to write about the texts we are reading. In math, we are continuing to practice our math facts, both subtraction and addition.

First Grade:

First Grade Families...February may be short, but it is filled with topics and themes that will keep us busy all month long! Let's Stay Connected...check in with your child's teacher if you have any questions or concerns. Remember to look in your child's communication folder every night and clean it out. In reading, we are focusing on Stories Teach Many Lessons (fiction stories). Please read every night for at least 30 minutes! In writing, we are focusing on writing about our opinions. In math, we will be learning how to plot, order, and compare 2-digit numbers. At home, practice counting forward and back, and 10 more/10 less on the 100 chart. In social studies, we will be learning about: American History. In science, the big idea is: Matter in Motion. The essential question is, "How do objects move?" At home, guess what objects may sink or float. SCIENCE NIGHT was a huge success, thank you for those that attended. Please continue to read with your child and ask them what they are learning.

Second Grade:

We cannot believe we are past the 100 day of school mark, we had so much fun celebrating becoming 100 days smarter. This month is black history month and we are so excited to learn about black culture and achievements made by important black individuals. In math this month we are learning about money and time, next time you pay for the groceries, ask your child to figure out the change! In reading, we are reading about different folk tales and how different cultures can teach us different lessons. Some important upcoming events this month include: 2/2 is our field trip to the Norton museum of art, 2/14 is our Valentine's day celebration so students are allowed to bring in cards or treats for the class to celebrate friendships they have made, and 2/19 there is no school. Please remember to continue checking your child's blue folder for important information! Thanks for all of your support!

Third Grade:

We are excited to share updates on our progress in the new year. Students recently completed their second iReady Reading and Math Diagnostic. We are thrilled with the progress they have made! Our teachers will be utilizing this data to tailor their instruction and ensure that students are well-prepared for the end-of-the-year state assessment.

As February is Black History Month, we will be dedicating time to recognize and honor the achievements, contributions, and rich history of African American people from around the world. Students will have the opportunity to learn about the important role African Americans play in shaping the story of our country.

Our next Benchmark unit in reading is "Making Decisions." Throughout this unit, we will explore various character traits and draw conclusions about the lessons these characters learn and the themes we can infer. In math, over the next two units, students will be learning about fractions. By the end of the units, students should be able to identify, represent, and write fractions in multiple ways.

Please continue to monitor your child's homework completion and encourage them to read for at least 20 minutes each night. Furthermore, please mark your calendars as report cards will be available on SIS (Student Information System) on February 22.

Thank you for your unwavering support and collaboration in your child's education!

Fourth Grade:

Hello again fabulous 4th grade parents! Upcoming this month is Black History Month, Yoga club every Tuesday morning 7-7:30 for 4th grade students, Thursday Feb 15th Kona Ice, Literacy Breakfast 7:15am for 4th grade, Thursday Feb 22nd report cards post to the gateway portal online, Friday Feb 23rd the Scholastic Book Fair begins, and Thursday Feb 29th is the Friendship dance! Thank you for continuing to communicate with your child's teacher, ensuring that your child is completing their homework daily and here on time each morning!

Fifth Grade:

Thank you to all the families who came out to STEM night. It was a lot of fun as we went through the hands-on stations. It was nice to see so many families come out and have fun learning. We have been working on poetry during our reading block. In science we have been learning about force and motion. Math has been all about fractions. We are diving into dividing fractions.
