This test will show teachers what the students know and what they need remediation on. Teachers will utilize the data and create groups to reteach students on the standards they did not master. Applicants will be chosen by a lottery selection, which occurs in the spring. DL Middle Schools are Okeeheelee, Palm Springs, LC Swain, Lake Worth, & North Grade.

The testing window for ACCESS begins on January 24th and ends on March 11th. All ELL K-5 students will take the ACCESS language proficiency test during this time period. The test measures the student's progress in listening, speaking, reading and writing. Individual student report scores will be sent home at a later date. More information is coming soon. <u>Kindergarten News</u> – Happy New Year from the Kindergarten Teachers! We hope you all enjoyed your winter break! With each New Year we reflect on the year before and determine goals for the New Year. Our Kindergarteners are working hard to reach their weekly & trimester goals. Weekly our goal is to complete 45 minutes of i-ready or i-station and at least 45 minutes of SuccessMaker a week in school. At home their goal for school is to complete their homework and read a book each night. This trimester our Kindergarteners goals are to be reading independently at a level C. If you need recommendations or have any questions on level C books, please ask your child's classroom teacher and they would be happy to help you find ways to support your child in reaching their reading goal.

1st Grade News - Welcome back families and students! We hope you had a fun and relaxing time off! As we begin the New Year be sure to continue to work on the skills we are learning on a daily basis. Also, be sure to review any skills we have already learned. We missed you all, we are excited to be back! In reading, we will continue with Unit 4: Perspectives in Literature: Stories Have a Narrator (Dec 13 - Jan 21). Then, we will begin Unit 5: Technology and Society: Technology at Work (Jan 24 - Feb 18). At home, read fiction/nonfiction texts and ask yourself questions about what you've read. In writing, we will be writing about our opinions. At home, give your child a choice (play inside or outside) and have them explain why they would choose it, then write about why. In math, we will focus on Unit 8: Understanding Place Value. At home, review writing and saying numbers 1-20 and practice skip counting by 5's and 10's to 100. In science, we will be focusing on Unit 5: Matter and Its Properties. Be on the lookout for STEM night (1/19)! At home observe, describe, and identify different objects. In social studies, we are beginning Unit 4: World of Work...discussing the difference between goods, services, and how to save money. At home, discuss how you can save money and set a goal. If you ever have any questions or concerns, please reach out to us. We are here for you! Thank you for all your support!

2nd Grade News – Welcome back second grade Eagles, we are excited to be back after the break and are looking forward to the rest of the school year! Please, mark your calendars for Jan 19, 2022, the school will be holding the Science Night from 6:00 - 7:30, we hope to see you there. The second grade will be presenting Life cycles and we will be located in the kindergarten's hallway and finally parents, please remember that your kids should be reading at least 20 minutes per day, this includes reading to self, reading to you, and being read to in any language.

3rd Grade News – Happy New Year 2022, Freedom Shores Families! 3rd grade has SOARed through 2021! We are setting goals and continuing to monitor progress towards them. All students need 45 min. and 0.03 gains per week for Successmaker Math, and 45 min. and 70%+ accuracy for iReady Reading, weekly. Their success in reaching these goals is being encouraged and celebrated! Teachers and students are monitoring this growth as we track progress. 3rd grade will be taking both the ELA and Math Diagnostics this month. We will share the data as soon as it is available. Writers will be taking the Palm Beach Performance Assessment for Informative writing. In Reading, we are exploring genres of fiction: stories old and new! During Math, we are solving multi-step word problems using the four operations. We're looking forward to observing, classifying and describing some physical properties of matter in Science. We can't wait to see all the Science Fair projects the students have done. We hope you'll join our Science Night on Wednesday, January 19th! 3rd grade really enjoyed learning and celebrating Winter Holidays Around the World in December! This month, we will identify places and regions around the world. We will also honor, celebrate and learn about Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s accomplishments and contributions! Please remember to check the blue communication folder for homework and sign your child's agenda each day. Thank you so much for your continued support from home, it's appreciated!
