Dress Code Reminders - The students at Freedom Shores are expected to follow a mandatory uniform dress code on Monday through Thursday. Students who are not dressed in the proper school uniform should be sent to the office and the appropriate action will be taken. The mandatory school uniform dress code is as follows:

- All students will wear collared shirts with sleeves of any solid color
- Pants, capris, skirts, jumpers, skorts, or shorts must be navy blue, black, khaki, gray, or brown. Shorts, skorts, and skirts must be long enough to touch the bottom of the fingertips, worn at the natural waistline and must be uniform style.
- No denim/jeans.
- Leggings/Jeggings may not be worn alone.
- **FRIDAYS ONLY**: Official Freedom Shores school spirit shirts and jeans, NO RIPPED JEANS. Students may also donate \$1 in order to participate in Dress Down Fridays, where they may wear their choice of appropriate clothing. Proceeds support the Eagle Buck Store, STEM Lab, DL Department and 5th grade class.
- Distracting or disruptive clothing and accessories are not to be worn
- Per School District Policy, footwear must be completely enclosed in the toe and back for safety reasons. Sneakers and flat shoes are appropriate.

If your child is sent home with borrowed uniform clothes, please launder and return the next day. Thank you.

If ALL of the students in your child's class are in proper uniform, they will be awarded an eagle in their class!

<u>Kindergarten News</u> – Our Kindergarteners will be working on Unit 6 in our Reading program. In this unit, students will read folktales from diverse cultures and compare the messages or lessons within them. They will develop the following Enduring Understandings:

- People tell traditional stories, like folktales, to teach important lessons.
- Stories can teach us that ordinary people can accomplish big things, especially when they work together.

We will be learning the following sight words; for, no, one, jump and girl. Please practice these at home too! See your child's teacher to request a complete list of our sight words.

We will be working on two Units this month in Math. Unit 11; Numbers to 100 and Unit 12; Identifying and Describing Shapes. At home, you can go on a walk together and point out objects you see. Ask your child, "What shapes do you see?" Go on a shape hunt, search for squares, circles, etc. Count how many sides or corners each shape has that you find in your home or on your walk.

Just a reminder to make sure to sign your child's folder & have your child complete their homework each night. As always thank you for your support!

In Reading, we are comparing and contrasting across texts! During Math, we are working with fraction equivalence and comparison, then moving into solving time, capacity, and mass problems. Thank you for participating in Math Night! The students and parents enjoyed the hands-on activities! In Social Studies, 3rd graders researched and studied Black History. During this time, students were invited to learn about African American inventors, scientists, athletes, entertainers, and the rich history of African American culture!
