



ISTATION PARENT PORTAL

Do you know what tier your child is on? If not, there are two easy ways to find out! First, ask your child's Spanish teacher or as a parent of a student in the Dual Language program, you have access to the online Istation Parent Portal!

To begin, go to https://www.istation.com/istationhome. The first time you log in, you will be prompted to select your student's school. Type in the school information. (This will only be done once.) Then, type in your student's login information as provided by your teacher and click Log In. This Login is different from the school district login. If you need help or have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask your child's Spanish teacher or Ms. Concepcion at maibelis.concepcion@palmbeachschools.org.



Kindergarten:

Continue to have your child practice counting to 120 to strengthen those math skills!. Look in your child's communication folder every night and clean it out. Stay Connected!...check in with your child's teacher if you have any questions or concerns.



Second Grade:

Hi second grade families!! Happy February, we cannot believe we have officially passed the 100th day of school! We had such a fun time celebrating becoming 100 days smarter. This month is black history month and we are so excited to learn about black culture and achievements made by important black individuals. This month we are learning about time and money! We have loved using what we know about money to shop at the Eagle Buck Store! In reading this unit is all about tales to live by. Ask your child about the Folktale Villago of the Moon Rain. In science, we are focusing on uses and forces of energy. Please remember to check your child's blue folder for important information and upcoming events. Third Grade:

Hello 3rd Grade Families! We have been working hard since we returned from Winter Break. The students completed their F.A.S.T. Progress Monitoring 2 for Reading and Math, and teachers will be contacting parents for data chats to discuss each child's progress. In math, students will be starting Unit 10: Understanding Fractions as Numbers. In this unit, students will be able to identify, represent, and write fractions in a variety of ways. Please continue to monitor your child's homework and tests. Lastly, we are going on a field trip to the Kravis Center on Monday, February 13. Permission slips will be sent home soon.
