#### <u>A Message from Assistant Principal</u> <u>Kimberly Rogers</u>

Parents with students in grades 3-5: Students just finished their first Progress Monitoring (PM) Test in ELA and Math. Each progress monitoring test covers the full "test blueprint," meaning that all content expectations for that subject and grade level are assessed. Therefore, for PM 1 and PM2, your student may not yet be at grade level; however, this does not necessarily indicate that a student is not on track to succeed. It is important for teachers and families to understand that score information is intended to provide baseline and mid-year results for PM1 and PM2 respectively. These results are for informational purposes only and should be used to identify areas that may need additional instruction and support. These results should not be considered student achievement designations. If you have any questions regarding your child's score, reach out to their teacher.

# **DRESS CODE**

Dress Code Reminders - The students at Freedom Shores are expected to follow a mandatory uniform dress code on Monday through Thursday. Students who are not dressed in the proper school uniform should be sent to the office and the appropriate action will be taken. The mandatory school uniform dress code is as follows:

- All students will wear collared shirts with sleeves of any solid color.
- Pants, capris, skirts, jumpers, skorts, or shorts must be navy blue, black, khaki, gray, or brown. Shorts, skorts, and skirts must be long enough to touch the bottom of the fingertips, worn at the natural waistline and must be uniform style.
- No denim/jeans.
- Leggings/Jeggings may not be worn alone.
- **FRIDAYS ONLY**: Official Freedom Shores school spirit shirts and jeans, NO RIPPED JEANS. Students may also donate \$1 in order to participate in Dress Down Fridays, where they may wear their choice of appropriate clothing. Proceeds support the Eagle Buck Store, STEM Lab, DL Department and 5th grade class.
- Distracting or disruptive clothing and accessories are not to be worn.
- Per School District Policy, footwear must be completely enclosed in the toe and back for safety reasons. Sneakers and flat shoes are appropriate.

If your child is sent home with borrowed uniform clothes, please launder and return the next day. Thank you.

If ALL of the students in your child's class are in proper uniform, they will be awarded an eagle in their class!

<u>Kindergarten News</u> – In math we have been comparing numbers 0-5 and are moving on to numbers 6-10. Have your child practice counting objects and writing their numbers 0-10. Some fun ideas to practice writing numbers include: forming their numbers with playdough, using a tray of sand or salt to write numbers, painting numbers with paint or painting numbers with water on the sidewalk, writing numbers with sidewalk chalk, and using a Kindergarten favorite "smelly markers"!

In science, our Kindergarteners have been exploring the world around them using their 5 senses. At home, take a listening walk together, write down or talk about the things you both heard. Play "I spy" and describe things for your child to find, or make microwave popcorn and discuss all 5 senses; sound, smell, touch, sight, and taste! We are looking forward to using our senses this month to explore some fall favorites; apples & pumpkins!

Please continue reading with your child each night, and have your child work on logging on to their computer. Have them practice entering both their username and password, our goal is for them to be able to do this independently. Please remember to check and sign your child's communication folder each night. Thank you for all of your support at home!

<u>1st Grade News</u> - Happy Autumn 1st Grade Families! Our students are learning and growing every day. We are so proud of them. Please look at your child's communication folder everyday for the daily behavior log and homework assignments. In reading, ask and answer questions about a text, this will increase your child's comprehension. In math, encourage your child to count on (+) and count back (-) objects to increase fluency. In science, read books about animals and plants and talk about the facts that were learned. In social studies we are celebrating Hispanic Heritage. Take some time to recognize the contributions and influence Hispanic Americans made to the history, culture, and achievements for the US. Thank you for always being so supportive!

 $2^{nd}$  Grade News – Happy October from Second Grade! We are so excited for the fall season to finally kick off! In math we have been learning about using different strategies to add numbers up to 100. In reading we have been learning about how characters face their problems. Ask us about Molly the Milkmaid! Please remember to check your child's blue communication folder each night to keep with important information and dates!

<u>3<sup>rd</sup> Grade News</u> – Happy October! The Storybook Parade is happening again this year on October 31st. Be on the lookout for more information from your child's teacher.

Here is what we are learning in 3rd grade:

We are making our way through Unit 2 of Benchmark, "Ways Characters Shape Stories". We'll be reading fables, folktales, myths, and poems. Our focus in math is using multiplication to divide. Please practice with your child their multiplication facts 0-12 so they can develop automaticity. In science, we are learning about parts of a plant and photosynthesis, and in social studies, we will be learning about our government and Hispanic Heritage Month.



 $5^{\text{th}}$  Grade News – 5th grade has been working very hard in class and learning lots of new concepts. Please make sure your child arrives at school on time, as we start right at 8:00 am! We have completed our first FAST assessment of the school year for both Reading and Math. The results will help teachers know skills to work on with your child. In ELA we have been working hard on annotating our reading passages and we have been practicing how to type our writing. In math we have been working on multiplying with decimals. In AMP math, the students have been learning rational numbers in all four operations. For science we have been studying different animal adaptations. On October 31st students can dress up as their favorite storybook character. We hope all the 5th graders come dressed up and represent the characters they like to read.
