We are rolling into another exciting school year. Over the summer, we had summer school, summer camp and 21 st Century camp on our campus and our custodial staff was still able to make our campus look beautiful!!!

The children in grades 3-5 will be using the same program that our K-2 students used last year and are using again this year; Benchmark. In addition, the students will be using the new B.E.S.T. Standards for Mathematics. All of the standards are focused on the concepts the children need to know for each grade level and to be prepared for the next grade We will also be continuing our iReady program for reading and also using it for mathematics this year as well. There will be a friendly competition going on throughout the school based on usage and accuracy with these programs.

Our car line in both the morning and the afternoon has greatly improved thanks to the fantastic PTO who purchased the dismissal program call CurbSmart that we use. Please remember to be considerate to our neighbors and do not park on their property or in our bus loop. Here are a couple updates regarding our computer programs for reading and math.

Starting off this school year, students will take an initial diagnostic assessment for iReady reading and math. This test is adaptive and will adjust content to the students level. Students will be given a score based on where they test. This will then place them at that level for their daily lessons. As students pass lessons, they will progress with level and difficulty.

You will be receiving a letter in the next week or so regarding the new state testing for K-5 called FAST. Please be on the lookout.

### **DRESS CODE**

Dress Code Reminders - The students at Freedom Shores are expected to follow a mandatory uniform dress code on Monday through Thursday. Students who are not dressed in the proper school uniform should be sent to the office and the appropriate action will be taken. The mandatory school uniform dress code is as follows:

- All students will wear collared shirts with sleeves of any solid color.
- Pants, capris, skirts, jumpers, skorts, or shorts must be navy blue, black, khaki, gray, or brown. Shorts, skorts, and skirts must be long enough to touch the bottom of the fingertips, worn at the natural waistline and must be uniform style.
- No denim/jeans.
- Leggings/Jeggings may not be worn alone.
- **FRIDAYS ONLY**: Official Freedom Shores school spirit shirts and jeans, NO RIPPED JEANS. Students may also donate \$1 in order to participate in Dress Down Fridays, where they may wear their choice of appropriate clothing. Proceeds support the Eagle Buck Store, STEM Lab, DL Department and 5th grade class.
- Distracting or disruptive clothing and accessories are not to be worn.
- Per School District Policy, footwear must be completely enclosed in the toe and back for safety reasons. Sneakers and flat shoes are appropriate.

If your child is sent home with borrowed uniform clothes, please launder and return the next day. Thank you.

If ALL of the students in your child's class are in proper uniform, they will be awarded an eagle in their class!

<u>1<sup>st</sup> Grade News</u> - Hello first grade families. We love getting to know your child each and every day! Our morning meetings have been very meaningful, so please make sure your child arrives on time for school! In ELA, we will be in Unit 1: Plants and Animals Grow and Change. At home, your child should find a cozy spot and read for 15 minutes every day. In science, we will be discovering what science is by using our senses to observe and describe objects. In social studies, we will be learning about American History. At home, discuss the sequence of things you do (first, second, third, etc...). In math, students gain a deeper understanding of addition and subtraction. At home, play math word problem games (how many more/how many less). Please send in headphones/earbuds, they are necessary when using the lap tops in class. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact your child's teacher.

 $2^{nd}$  Grade News – Second grade has had an awesome start to the new school year!! We have loved getting to know all the students and families. The students have done an incredible job reviewing the schoolwide SOAR procedures and have even earned some Eagle Bucks themselves. Morning Meetings have been our favorite time to learn about our classmates so please make sure students are on time each day. In ELA we are so excited to finally be in our first unit. We have been reading about emperor penguins and their habitats. In Math, we are finishing up chapter 1 and have learned all about adding and subtracting up to 20. 
<u>3<sup>rd</sup> Grade News</u> – Parents please remember to check students' agendas, communication folders, and ClassDojo (if used in class).
