We have started another exciting school year with magic. To open the school year, we introduced our new Hones System to the students and then sorted the Fourth and Fifth Graders into their houses. The rest of the school will be sorted through September. In addition, to kick off the school year all of our students took their first FAST assessment so we have a benchmark for where they are academically beginning their grade. We can also see if they had any summer loss. They also completed their lifeady diagnostic testing so they will now begin utilizing the program. We will continue our friendly competition for the class at each grade level with the highest percentage of student who work on iReady for the 45 minutes each week and receive a mastery percentage of or higher.

Our car line in both the morning and the afternoon has greatly improved thanks to the fantastic PTO who purchased the dismissal program call CurbSmart that we use. Please remember to be considerate to our neighbors and do not park on their property or in our bus loop. If you come through the car line and always pull up as far as you can, the line will move quickly and the children will be safely loaded into your cars.

We are looking to increase our parent involvement at our school this year so we changed the times of our School Advisory Council (SAC) and PTO meetings to each third Wednesday of the month starting at 7:00 am. We felt it might be easier for you to come in the morning when you are dropping your child off anyway. Please make every effort you can to attend these meetings so your input can be heard and acted on. You can become more active in your child's education by attending these meetings and the other school functions. I am excited to share that our school will be using a Mathematics and Reading program called i-Ready again this school year.

What is i-Ready?

i-Ready is an online program that will help us determine your child's strengths and areas for growth, personalize their learning, and monitor their progress throughout the school year. i-Ready allows us to meet your child where they are and provides us with data to inform instruction.

All students just completed the diagnostic. The i-Ready Diagnostic is an adaptive assessment that adjusts its questions based on student responses. Each item a student receives is based on their answer to the previous question. For example, a series of correct answers will result in slightly harder questions, while a series of incorrect answers will yield slightly easier ones. The purpose of this is not to give your child a score or grade but to determine how to best support their learning.

i-Ready Instruction provides students with lessons based on their individual strengths and areas for growth. These lessons are interactive and provide strategic supports to keep your child engaged as they learn.
