Greetings Panther Families!

We cannot believe that the month of October marks our ninth week of school! During these past nine weeks, our students have had the pleasure of learning a tremendous amount based on our Florida B.E.S.T. standards. We have already seen a lot of growth in our students and are excited to see it continue!

On Friday, September 29, all students were sent home with their Progress Reports. If a student is considered to be below grade level in reading or mathematics, he/she would have received a *Reading and Math Deficiency Letter*. This deficiency letter informs you, the parent, what we are doing at school to help improve your child's grades. We ask that you please sign and return this deficiency letter, as well as schedule a parent conference with the teacher to go over how you can help your child at home.

Safety is our number one priority for all students, staff, parents and guests on campus. We ask that the following procedures are followed to make sure that we continue to have a safe campus:

- ★ Students should begin arriving to school at 7:40 a.m., not earlier. Walkers should not be lined up at the gate prior to this time, as the students are unsupervised and creating some disruptions.
- ★ Photo Identification is always required when picking up a student, even if a staff member knows who you are. This is state policy.
- ★ Transportation changes will not take place over the phone unless there is an extreme circumstance and administration will be required to provide approval.
- ★ Parents will need to sign their child in if tardy. This allows the school to know that the child safely arrived to school with their parent
- ★ Students will not be dismissed early after 1:40 p.m. This policy is in place to ensure that students get to their correct dismissal location. Last minute dismissal changes can be very difficult on the teacher who is making sure that students are dismissed properly.

We would love for our students to show their teachers how much they appreciate them by creating a handwritten card or a small token of appreciation.




