I am pleased to share that we are off to a great start! On August 5 we welcomed approximately 700 freshmen to Cobra Country. Our Cobra cheerleaders led a spirited introduction to Park Vista. Over 100 Cobra Ambassadors, model student leaders, introduced our 9th graders to campus, provided tips for success, and showed them the Cobra way! Club sponsors and members, as well as athletic coaches, encouraged our freshmen to join activities and athletics. We hope that this introduction to high school eased the transition from middle school. I definitely enjoyed this opportunity to welcome our new Cobras! Our school counselors presented our Freshmenology program for parents and provided important information to help our parents support our freshmen during their high school educational journey and beyond. In the last few weeks we have distributed schedules, Chromebooks, and IDs.

PV Teacher Has a New Super Power!

PV Social Science teacher Brenda Breckon has been developing a super-power this summer; learning how to see stories hiding in plain sight in America's colonial capital, Williamsburg, VA.

Ms. Breckon was one of sixty teachers from around the US chosen to participate in the "Hidden Histories of the Founding Era," a National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) Landmarks workshop. The Omohundro Institute of Early American History and Culture in partnership with the William & Mary Bray School Lab held two week-long sessions that brought participants to four key sites in the Williamsburg area.

OI Executive Director Catherine E. Kelly, co-director of the workshop, says "Building paths that will help the cutting-edge scholarship we support reach our nation's classrooms has been an amazing experience for the OI's staff and for me personally. The energy, engagement, and creativity of our teacher participants has been deeply inspirational for all of us. I cannot wait to see how they will apply their experiences with us in their classrooms and communities!"


