## STEPS TO COURSE SELECTION \& REGISTRATION

- Failure to complete this form will result in the counselors selecting your courses for you. You will only be able to submit this google form one time and must be logged into your google account.

ON AVERAGE, STUDENTS THAT COMPLETE A COLLEGE LEVEL COURSE (AP OR AICE) IN THEIR HIGH SCHOOL CAREER HAVE A 90\% PERSISTENCE RATE IN COLLEGE COMPARED TO A 60\% WITHOUT

## Advanced Placement (AP)

- AP courses are rigorous, relevant and help you stand out to colleges
- AP courses reflect work typical of introductory level college courses
- Students take required AP Exams at the end of the course in May
- By Florida State Statute, a score of 3 or higher on an AP Exam guarantees college credit within the State University System
- AP is recognized by nearly all of the almost 4,000 degree granting colleges and universities


## A Head Start in High School

Research consistently shows that AP students are better prepared for college than students who don't take AP, regardless of their exam score. They're more likely to enroll and stay in college, do well in their classes, and graduate in four years. Taking AP can help

Your AP score could earn you college credits before you even set foot on campus. In fact, most AP students who enroll in four-year colleges start school with some credit.

"AP" on your high school transcript shows colleges you're motivated to succeed, and taking the exam demonstrates your commitment to tackle and complete college-level work.


Save Money and Time
Earning credit or placement can open up time on your schedule or even let you graduate early.


Keep Your Options Open
Earning college credit with AP can give you the flexibility to change majors, pursue a second degree, study abroad, or seek internships.

- 85\% of selective colleges and universities report that a student's AP experience favorably impacts their admission decisions.
- In 2020, students across the U.S. earned 2,932,042 AP scores of 3 or higher, translating into potential cost savings of \$3.1 billion.
- Students who take 5 college level courses throughout high school have the best first year college GPA.


## "Research shows that when

 students are given access to advanced coursework opportunities, they work harder and engage more in school, leading to fewer absences and suspensions and higher graduation rates. (EdTrust, 2019)

Most colleges and universities use AP as a factor in evaluating candidates for admission. Twothirds of admissions and enrollment leadership indicate that AP courses are extremely or very helpful in evaluating candidates for admission.

- Consistency: As an internationally recognized program that includes a standardized assessment of knowledge and skills, AP offers a consistent and reliable measure of academic achievement.
- Evidence of rigor: Students with AP on their high school transcripts show exposure to rigorous, college-level curricula - a key element of readiness.
- Priority admission: AP Exam scores are frequently used as admission criteria for special programs or admission into select honors programs.


## Key Finding

AP Exam takers have higher four-year graduation rates than non-AP Exam takers-regardless of AP Exam score earned.

## Success Is More Than a Score

## Students who take AP courses and exams:

1. Are more likely than their peers to attend college and graduate on time.
2. And students who achieve an AP Exam score of 2 do significantly better in introductory college classes.
3. Also, students who achieve AP Exam scores of a 1 or 2 often earn a higher score on the subsequent AP Exams they take.

- Complete the AICE curriculum requirements by passing the required 7 AICE Classes and Exams as determined by the Florida Department of Education (FLDOE)
- Complete the community service hours: FAS - 100, FMS - 75
