By showing interest, verifying homework completion, reading in both languages at home, and keeping close communication with your child's teachers you will be providing the commitment needed for your child's success. Having a positive attitude and showing enthusiasm for the program are also essential.

For the program to be most effective, research indicates that it takes 5 to 7 years to learn a second language. It is expected that students enter the program in kindergarten and remain through fifth grade.
