ALTRUISMO - THE HOUSE OF GIVERS

Altruismo

Our House Crest

The most important visual representation of each House is its House Crest. This is a specially designed Coat of Arms filled with symbols that speak to the values of the House. The crests should never be changed or altered. Preserving them builds House heritage!

Heart

The heart sits at the top of the crest because the heart is where kindness, generosity, and purity are born.

Diamond + Shield

The diamond on the shield, in the center of the crest, represents the importance of protecting others with unity and wisdom.

Giver

"Altruismo" is Portuguese for "altruism," or "the givers" — and that is what we are known for being!



Griffin

With the head of an eagle and the courage of a lion, the griffin is one of the most powerful of all animals known for both strength and grace, fierceness and nurturing.

Black

The color black represents prestige and an elite quality, just like our kids. We are a House filled with talent, and we like to win.

Black is also the one color that contains all other colors — representing our goal of empowering all others.

PM1 READING & MATH

The Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) is a progress monitoring system that is administered three times per year to track your student's progress in learning the Benchmarks of Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) Standards throughout this school year.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that your student will participate in the first administration (PM1) of the Grades 6-8 Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) ELA Reading and Mathematics assessments on Wednesday, September 6th for FAST ELA Reading and Thursday, September 7th for FAST Math. Your student's results from PM1 are for informational purposes only, and you will be provided with information about how to access the results after testing is completed.

FAST assessments are computer-adaptive tests taken on a computer or tablet. The questions get easier or more difficult depending on how the student responds, and each student will see different questions from a common item bank. Each test attempt (PM1, PM2, and PM3) will present 35–40 items that will cover the entire test "blueprint," meaning students will encounter items representative of the standards within the subject or grade level. If you or your student would like to interact with the online testing platform or review FAST ELA Reading [and Mathematics] sample items at home, sample test materials are available at https://flfast.org/families.html.

Please review the following policies with your student before testing.

- Electronic Devices—Students are not permitted to access any electronic devices, including, but not limited to, cell phones, smartphones, and smartwatches, at any time during testing or during breaks (e.g., restroom). If your student is found with an electronic device or is found using Bluetooth/wireless headphones/earbuds during testing, his or her test may be invalidated.
- Calculator Policy—For Grades 7–8 FAST Mathematics, approved handheld scientific calculators may be used. For Grade 6 FAST Mathematics, a handheld four-function calculator may be used.
- Testing Rules Acknowledgment— All tests include a Testing Rules Acknowledgment that reads: "I understand the testing rules that were just read to me. If I do not follow these rules, my test score may be invalidated." Prior to testing, test administrators read the rules to students, and students acknowledge that they understand the testing rules by clicking the box in the secure browser indicating they understand the testing rules.
- Discussing Test Content after Testing— The last portion of the testing rules read to students before they click the box to accept the Testing Rules Acknowledgment states that because the content of all statewide assessments is secure, students may not discuss or reveal details about the test content (including test items and passages) after the test. This includes any type of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, or posting to social media sites. Please make sure your student understands this policy prior to testing and remind them that "discussing" test content includes any kind of electronic communication, such as texting, emailing, posting to social media, or sharing online. While students may not share information about secure test content after testing, this policy is not intended to prevent students from discussing their testing experiences with their parents/families.
- Working Independently—Students are responsible for doing their own work during the test and for protecting their answers from being seen by others. If students are caught cheating during testing, their tests will be invalidated.
- Testing Accommodations—If your student has an Individual Education Plan (IEP), a
 Section 504 Plan, or is an English Language Learner (ELL) or a recently exited ELL, please
 contact the school to discuss any testing accommodations that will be provided for your
 student.

STUDENT CONDUCTOR/TARDY POLICY

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Our school has partnered with Student Conductor in the implementation of a new, more effective tardy processing system. Here are the things that you need to know.

There are multiple tardy check-in kiosk stations located throughout the school.

- When tardy, the student will use the nearest check-in kiosk station to get them back into class efficiently.
- Every time a student is tardy, an email and/or text message is sent to a parent/guardian notifying them that the student was tardy. Any discipline assigned will also be notified to the parent/guardian.
- If a discipline is being assigned for the student being tardy then the student must serve
 the discipline by the appointed time. Failure to do so may result in an escalation of
 discipline. This system allows your principals, coaches, sponsors, counselors, and
 parents to easily track what disciplines have been served thereby increasing
 accountability.

The process is simple when a student is tardy.

- Scan or type the Student ID into the nearest Check-In Tardy Station.
- The student takes the tardy receipt and reads the discipline that has been assigned for being tardy.
- The student reports to class and shows the tardy receipt to your teacher as your pass to class.
- Then serve the assigned discipline.

Keep in mind that all tardy stations are monitored and further discipline will occur with the improper use of a check-in tardy station.

Consequences of tardiness can be avoided by students showing up on time for class.

Additionally, Student Conductor will also be used for daily badge check-in, tracking badge misplacement, dress code violations, teacher/admin detentions, and bathroom usage.


