What is the Early Childhood Education Academy?

The Early Childhood Teacher Education (ECTE) program provides the knowledge and skills necessary for employment in the child care industry. Students will enroll in one course each year of high school to complete the required courses. On top of the four courses, students will also be required to work hands-on with children, take certification exams, and create a resource portfolio.









EARLY CHILDHOOD PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION

Students who complete the entire program and meet all requirements as outlined in the Requirement Checklist for Students can be awarded the Early Childhood Professional Certificate (ECPC). The ECPC is a preschool specialization approved by the DCF as meeting the Staff Credential requirement. Also offer the CDA (Child Development Associate)

Requirements:

- 4 ECTE Courses (one per year)
 - 480 Volunteer/Intern Hours



- DCF 40 Hour Course and Exams
- DCF Literacy Online Course

All licensed child care facilities must have one credentialed staff member for every 20 children.

The ECPC is also one of the acceptable minimum credentials for employment as a Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) instructor.

Volunteer Hours

A large component of obtaining the ECPC is Volunteer Hours. 480 hours of direct work experience with children ages five (8) or younger must be completed to be eligible for the ECPC. The 480 hours are broken up by quarter each year with additional hours to be done during the summers.
