

Updates from Ms. White, Assistant Principal

Did you know that teachers with 3+ calendar years of successful teaching experience and rated as Effective or Highly Effective on their most recent evaluation are eligible to serve as a Clinical Educator Mentor for new teachers? At Meadow Park, our staff is eager to serve in this role and to share their knowledge with new and aspiring educators. We have almost 25 teachers that have completed coursework to attain this prestigious certification! This year, our "Clin Ed" certified teachers are serving in a couple of different roles, all of which ultimately help us deliver top-notch instruction to all of our students.

First, we have veteran teachers paired up with our new teachers in the Educator Support Program. Each month, we meet together in "Huddles" and share best practices. The mentors work with the new teachers in their classroom as well! At Meadow Park, we know that every educator has a wealth of knowledge, no matter the years of experience ...our mentors learn from their mentees as well!



Second, we have Clin Ed certified teachers paired up with University Student Interns. This semester, we have the privilege of hosting two student interns from Florida Atlantic University. In 1st grade, Mrs. Mahoney is working alongside Ms. Amairis Racine to complete her internship in Elementary Education. In 3rd grade, Mrs. Noakes is working alongside Ms. <u>Brigette Raudales</u> to complete her Elementary Education internship. We are honored to have them here at Meadow Park and can't wait for them to see everything that makes Meadow Park so special!

Updates from Mrs. Haag, SSCC

Students in kindergarten through 5th grade have all started a new reading unit focusing on technology. Balancing reading of literature with informational texts helps their vocabulary and comprehension. Be sure to choose both types of books to read with your child or ask them which books they have checked out of the Media Center.



Additionally, we are coming close to the end of the iReady Diagnostic window, which closes next Friday, January 19th. The

data coming in has shown great growth for the first semester of the school year. We're looking forward to even greater gains by the end of the year. Please continue to monitor your child's usage of iReady as well as their proficiency of lessons.



Updates from Mrs. MacCloud, Math Coach

The Mighty Eagle mathematicians are continuing to soar! Our delightful Kindergarten students are working on adding and subtracting to 10. Our hard-working First graders are mastering place value concepts. The tenacious Second graders are zooming

along with addition and subtraction equations with unknown numbers. Our brave Third graders are beginning to extend numerical patterns. The determined Fourth graders are identifying and generating equivalent fractions. Our feisty Fifth graders are adding and subtracting fractions with unlike denominators. And finally, the steadfast students participating in Sixth grade math are braving the world of percentages. As always, parents, continue to encourage your children to master their basic math facts (addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division). Also, second through fifth graders can work on IXL and iReady Math at home to get extra practice.

Grade Level Updates

PreK

We are working hard on getting our little ones back in a routine. Some of us are doing Themes about Snowmen and Snow, Winter Animals, and with our Frog-Street Curriculum will be about "Tales". Please check your child's bookbag for activities that they have been doing daily. You can discuss with your child what they did for that specific day. Daily Language Skills are very important. *****Some parents will be getting notices for Transition to Kindergarten Meetings. Please adhere to these times. It is very hard to reschedule.

******Parent's please get here on time. We have had a lot of late students. Remember, instruction starts promptly at 8:00a.m. We want to have a good start to the New Year!

Kindergarten

We are excited to continue building our addition and subtraction fluency in Math. We are beginning a new unit in Reading. In this unit, we will read and learn about the different kinds of technology that we use at home and school. We will develop the following Enduring Understandings:

- Technology is changing how we work, learn, travel, and live.
- We can use technology to interact with others in new ways.

Our students love exhibiting their knowledge of the Scientific Method and are having fun seeing themselves as Scientist as we complete our class Science Fair projects!

First Grade

We are so excited to start this New Year! This month we have started a new unit in reading. Our unit focuses on Technology. Students will learn and use prior knowledge to: identity main ideas, compare and contrast relevant information, and enhance vocabulary. We started working on expository writing. In math, we are continuing to work on place value. In science, we have started to work on our science project. Don't forget to read every night!

Second Grade

We look forward to starting the new year with our first field trip to the Palm Beach Zoo on January 17th! The kids are very excited to see real life animals and learn more about their habitats and adaptations. This month the students will begin learning about the basics of fractions. In science, we will be working on completing our class Science Fair Project.

Third Grade

In reading, the students will be learning how to explain ideas and making connections in the events of the text. In math, Unit 9, student dive into number patterns. The students should be working hard to complete their Science Fair project.

Fourth Grade

We look forward to starting off our next Reading Unit in text structures in text about technology. In Math, we will begin our unit about equivalent fractions. Our St. Augustine trip is coming up,

Fifth Grade

January 26th is the deadline for the choice application for middle school.

In science students are wrapping up their science fair projects . We are currently learning about circuits and will be doing a variety of hands on labs to test our knowledge.

In reading we're focusing on test features and how they help us depend our understanding of the text we are reading .

Our super scientists and STEM Stars are back in the STEM swing of things! Our Kindergarten-Third graders will be constructing and designing various simple machines using the STEM Design process. Third Graders will finish their unit on food webs. All students will be coding with the robots.



Are you interested in signing your child for VPK at Meadow Park for the FY25 School year? We will be following the below steps for the selection process this year.

- 1. Starting January 15, 2024 at 9:00 a.m., you can fill out the google form by scanning the QR Code below. The form will be available until February 2, 2024 at 3:00 p.m. Fill the form out to express your interest in the program.
- 1. After 3:00 p.m. on February 2, 2024, we will no longer be accepting applications.
- 1. Filling out this form does not guarantee a spot in the program. Spots are filled based on a lottery system.
- Phone calls letting you know if your child has been accepted will be made from February 12, 2024 to February 23, 2024. You must have all required documents at the time the phone call is made to secure your spot.
- 1. If you receive a call stating your child is accepted, registration will take place at Meadow Park Elementary March 4, 2024-March 15, 2024
