To increase reading on grade level by 3rd grade, our school will concentrate on developing academic vocabulary, nonfiction writing, and improving reading comprehension in grades K-5. To increase high school readiness and prepare our students for college and careers our school will concentrate on number sense and foundational reading skills in grades K-2.

Schools Responsibilities

Teachers agree to work to improve student comprehension in reading and computation skills in mathematics. Key connections with families will be:

- Post updates, strategies, and academic resources to support learning at home on the Schoolwide Class Dojo Page
- Provide morning extended learning opportunities before the school day
- Actively communicate with parents and families through Class Dojo to share students academic progress and achievements
- Distribute / post a monthly newsletter which features updates regarding the academic standards being addressed in class.

- Regularly provide books that support the learning of diverse cultures and for students to read independently at home.
- Offer at least 1 academically focused parent training each trimester.
- Provide ongoing opportunities for parents to meet, share experiences, and make decisions relating to the education of their children.
- Explain curriculum, assessments, share student performance results and assist parents in interpreting data.
- Conduct at least two parent conferences to share and document student academic achievements and to monitor their progress.
- Create a welcoming, safe, supportive and effective learning environment for students.

- Attend parent training to learn more strategies to help my child learn at home and increase reading and math skills.
- Look for and read the newsletter each month and check school website and Class Dojo for school updates and events
- Encourage child to complete assignments
- Ensure that my child attends school every day, is dressed for success, ready to learn, and follows all school-wide rules and procedures.
- Be supportive of our school wide behavioral expectations and encourage students to follow them at all times as well as reinforce them at home.
- Be available to attend two conferences or meetings to discuss my child's academic, social and behavioral progress each year.
- Reinforce reading and math skills by engaging students in real life activities and assisting students with
