Meadow Park Families,

The School District of Palm Beach County is excited to announce our new volunteer management system launched on March 25, 2024. As an existing volunteer in our schools, we wanted to share the new process with you first!

Please complete the new <u>Volunteer Application</u> to skip this step at the school when you arrive to volunteer.

The first time you arrive to volunteer at a school, you must present your government-issued ID to the front office staff to be entered into the volunteer system. If you still need to complete the <u>Volunteer Application</u>, you must do so before you can volunteer.

After the front office has successfully scanned your government-issued ID, you can use the volunteer Kiosk located in the school's front office to sign in and out.

Once you sign in using the Kiosk, you can present your photo ID to the office staff to retrieve your volunteer badge.

Testing Season kicks off April 2 and April 3 with 5th and 4th grade students taking their state Writing Assessment!

- Attendance Matters! Just a friendly reminder about the importance of your child being PRESENT and ON TIME for their assessment. Testing with their classmates and teacher provides the best support and learning environment. An absence on testing day means they have to do a makeup test and miss out on valuable class time.
- Electronic Devices such as cell phones, smart watches, or Airpods, etc. are not allowed during testing. Students will not be allowed to have these devices in the testing room. If a student is found with an electronic device, his or her test will be invalidated.
- Look for more testing reminders in the Parent Letter that was sent home with your child!
- 4th/5th Grade Parents: Please note that the Writing Assessment results are not "instant" like the Reading and Math. Scores will be available after June 30.
- Review the calendar above and write your child's testing dates in their student agenda before
 April 12th to earn a prize for the clue of the month!

Updates from Mrs. Haag, SSCC


All students are beginning to work on poetry including writing their own poems. Each grade will also be starting a new informational unit in reading where they will be learning about seasons, weather and climate.

Continue to support reading at home by reading with your child daily. Ask questions that include why or how the author included details or illustrations and photographs in the books and texts they're reading. The more they read both in school and at home the more they will grow both academically and as readers too!

Our 4th and 5th grade students have been working hard to prepare for the state writing test on April 2nd and 3rd. Let's celebrate their efforts on the first of their final state assessments for this school year.

The Soaring Eagles are getting ready for their final Math Progress Monitoring assessments in April and May. Students are busy reviewing right now in class. Parents, please encourage your children to stay focused in class and ask questions if they do not understand a concept!



You can help your child at home by encouraging them to do extra IXL or Math iReady practice, reviewing basic math facts, and building their confidence.

Grade Level Updates

In Kindergarten we are building our reading fluency and deepening our understanding of informational texts by retelling the text and using the topic and multiple details. Our Math lessons are "shaping" up nicely as we work to identify, compare and compose 2-dimensional figures. Kindergarten STAR testing is April 18th and April 22nd.

First Grade

First Grade is starting measurement in Math. We are also finishing up a non-fiction unit in Reading on Statues and Monuments. We will test STAR Reading PM3 April 17. Math will test April 24. We will start IREADY testing May 13.

Second Grade

Second grade is springing into measurement in the month of April in math! We are finishing addition and subtraction up to 1,000. Please continue addition and subtraction skills at home! We are currently reading nonfiction texts, answering questions about text features and the central idea. We will be taking our STAR PM3 assessments on 4/16 and 4/23.

Third Grade

Third grade is getting ready and motivated for PM3! Try to have your child do 15-20 of i-ready reading at home. In Unit 7 Reading we will be finishing up the unit of Communities then and now. What is the author's claim and purpose? Unit 13 math is about graphs and understanding what the math questions are asking. Science is finishing the unit on heat and friction

Fourth Grade

Fourth Grade is gearing up for the testing season. In math, we will begin our final unit in geometry next week. Please review geometry vocabulary that will be sent home with your child. In Reading, we will focus on poetry in the month of April. Lastly, in all subjects we take time each day to spiral review all lessons taught this year. Please ensure your child is reading every night and completing their homework.

Fifth Grade

The 5th graders will be taking their state writing test Tuesday, April 2, 2024. Please make sure all students go to bed early Monday, eat a good breakfast Tuesday and get to school on time!



Student ID Replacement Procedures

Since the School District incurs costs related to providing ID badges to students, a student's first replacement ID badge within the school year will be free of charge to the student. In the event that a student needs a replacement ID badge beyond the first replacement ID badge a fee may be imposed to cover the replacement costs directly related to the replacement ID badge. If a student requires a replacement badge in excess of five times during the school year, the Principal or Assistant Principal is authorized to follow the established processes for the determination of consequences in compliance with the Student Code of Conduct Policies – Level 1 (5.1812 and 5.1813).

Students who have lost their ID more than one time are now being charged \$5.00. The \$5.00 replacement cost for a replacement badge will include a basic lanyard.

Help Keep Our School Safe!

It is important to remind students of the multiple ways to report bullying on campus and address what to do if they are experiencing any antisemitic incidents at school. The District has several ways a student can report bullying, and it goes directly to the principal of each school:

- The Bullying Hotline 561-434-8200- they can report by calling it in, and a taped recording is sent directly to the school principal.
- Go to <u>ReportBully PalmBeachSchools.org</u>, which opens a form and sends it directly to the principal.
- Scan a QR Code from posters found on campus to get to the same reporting form.
- A reporting form is also available from the Student Portal at sign-on.
