Application for Advanced Placement/AICE Courses – Student Information

<u>Deadline for online applications is midnight Thursday, February 1, 2024. Any applications received after this date will be placed on a waiting list.</u> A separate application for each AP/AICE course must be completed online. A list of students accepted will be posted online on **February 9.** If you are accepted into an AP/AICE class, you <u>must</u> then obtain both the AP/AICE teacher's and your parent's signatures on your course selection sheet. Turn in your course selection sheet to your period 5 teacher by **Friday, February 23, 2024.**

What is an AP/AICE Class? An Advanced Placement / AICE course is a college level course taught at the high school.

Why take an AP/AICE class? Students who complete the course and receive a passing score on the corresponding test may receive both high school and college credit, depending on the college's individual requirements. Grades in AP/AICE courses receive the highest HPA, which is used in class ranking. For example, an "A" in an AP/AICE course is weighted as a 6.0 whereas an "A" in an honors course is weighted as a 4.5. Even more importantly, colleges give greater weight to an application, which indicates that AP/AICE courses have been taken; selective colleges expect that all of their incoming students have an AP/AICE level background. They know historically that a student with this rigorous academic background is better prepared to excel in college. Colleges give greater weight to AP/AICE courses than to dual enrollment courses because courses have nationally standardized curriculums.

What are the qualifications for acceptance into an AP/AICE course? Teachers look at several factors in the student's academic history. Standardized test scores such as the FSA and PSAT are considered. Also, GPA and excellence in previous similar curriculum are factors. Finally, work ethic and attendance are evaluated. Since the course is based on college curriculum, an AP/AICE course is extremely demanding in both the rigor of course content and the workload.
