We are closing in on being halfway done with the school year, and what a great year it has been so far. Your children have been working very hard and it has been fun to watch them improve academically. We are proud of the students and the learning that is taking place in the classrooms.

In February, the school hosted an Academic Game Night which was well attended by our school community. The students, parents and teachers engaged in hands on experiments and played academic based games. On March 7, 2024, we held a FAST Parent Training Night event which provided parents the opportunity to gain information about the ELA, Math and Science FSA Assessment. Teachers reviewed strategies and shared resources that parents could utilize to help their child at home. Parents were provided with an opportunity to learn strategies the teachers are utilizing in the classroom to teach the various skills for students' success. Parents were given an opportunity to ask questions and receive answers about the curriculum and the assessment.

On Tuesday, April 16, 2024 and Wednesday, April 17, 2024, our students in kindergarten through second grade will be completing the ELA Assessment. On Tuesday, April 23, 2024 and Wednesday, April 24, 2024 the students will be completing the math assessment. It is imperative that all students attend school on those testing days.

The second round of Parent University has started. We are eager to provide our non-English speaking parents with classes that will help them to learn the English Language. They will write about their observations of growing seeds in their science journals. Additionally, they will build on concepts of letters and sounds as they blend sounds together into words, consider social problems and how to cooperate, and explore shapes by further learning about their attributes.
