FY22 FLORIDA KINDERGARTEN READINESS SCREENER (FLKRS) STAR EARLY LITERACY REPORT

The FY22 FLKRS STAR Early Literacy (SEL) assessment¹ data were released by the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) on February 3, 2022. For FY22, the FLKRS administration window was from August 10 through September 23, 2021. This document summarizes the data. For the present analyses, students' FLKRS scores were joined to their demographics and school assignments as of February 7, 2022. The highest score was used in the case of multiple scores for a student.

Table 1 displays the Kindergarten (KG) enrollment, FLKRS-SEL participation, and Kindergarten Readiness Rates. Among Kindergarten students entering in the Fall of FY22, 51.4% were deemed Kindergarten Ready, which is slightly above the state average level of 50%.2 The FY22 Kindergarten Readiness Rate (51.4%) is similar to the historical Readiness Rates, but lower than the 61.5% registered in FY21. The elevated FY21 Readiness Rate is due to the lower participation (66.1%) that was obtained due to distance learning during the Covid-19 Pandemic.

¹ Florida Statute 1002.69 requires the FDOE to adopt a State-wide Kindergarten screening instrument that assesses the readiness of each student for Kindergarten based on the performance standards adopted by the FDOE, under section 1002.67(1), F.S., for the VPK Program.

² The Florida Department of Education specifies a FLKRS score of 500 as "Kindergarten Ready".

Tables 2A and 2B display the percentage of students who were KG Ready by gender and ethnicity. Beyond the FDOE definition of "Ready," Table 2B also includes the five Literacy Classifications assigned by the STAR assessment overall and for student's subgroups⁴ White-Females at 70.9% and White-Males at 66.7% were the highest performing groups, while Hispanic-Males at 38.4% and Black-Males at 39.8% comprised lower performing groups. Students with Disabilities (SWD) and English Language Learners (ELL) registered readiness rates of 40.2% and 22.3%, respectively.

⁴ STAR Early Literacy Scaled Scores are used to classify every student into one of three broad stages of reading development: A. Emergent Reader, which is divided into: Early Emergent Reader - Scaled Scores ranging from 300 to 487; Late Emergent Reader - Scaled Scores ranging from 488 to 674; B. Transitional Reader, which is divided into: Early Transitional Reader - Scaled Scores from 675 to 724; Late Transitional Reader - Scaled Scores ranging from 725 to 774; and C. Probable Reader - Scaled Scores from 775 to 900.

Tables 3A and 3B display the Mean Scale Scores (ranging from 300-900) and subdomain scores (ranging from 1-99) for the District and student subgroups. The subdomain represents the skills assessed by the FLKRS-SEL. Across subgroups, **Visual Discrimination** (differentiate both upper and lower case letters, identify words that are different and match words that are the same) had the highest average score (70.3), while **Paragraph Comprehension** (assesses a student's ability to identify the main topic of text and the ability to answer literal and inferential questions after listening to or reading text) and **Structural Analysis** (assesses a student's understanding of affixes and syllable patterns in decoding and identification of compound words) had the lowest average score (31.0).

Table 4 displays the Readiness Rates for students tested at each District-operated school. Among the District-operated schools with 10 or more students tested, Morikami Park Elementary at 89.8% had the highest percent of students Kindergarten Ready while Highland Elementary at 18.2% had the lowest percent. Table 5 displays the Kindergarten Readiness Rates at Charter schools. Ben Gamla at 79.5% had the highest Kindergarten Readiness Rate while Glades Academy at 33.3% had the lowest (See Table 5).

Elementary school staff should review these and other available data, such as the iReady diagnostic, to uncover the strengths and weaknesses of our entering Kindergarten students. Targeting early support to address deficiencies is essential to ensuring students are prepared for success throughout their education and beyond. Schools might use the Kindergarten data to understand which groups of students struggle with which skills. Some suggested reflection questions are:

- Which groups of students are not ready for Kindergarten?
- Are there particular skills where they are struggling?
- What interventions are available to help these students?
- What support is needed to help these students?
